1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section sections 15.1-37-01, 15.1-37-05, 15.1-37-06,

2 and 15.1-37-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood education

3 programs, providers, grants, and data collection.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
6	amended and reenacted as follows:					
7	15.1-37-01. Early childhood education program - Approval.					
8	1.	Any	person or school district operating an early childhood education program may			
9		request approval of the program from the superintendent of public instruction. The				
10		superintendent shall approve an early childhood education program if the program:				
11		a.	Is taught by individuals who are licensed to teach in early childhood education by			
12			the education standards and practices board or approved to teach in early			
13			childhood education by the education standards and practices board;			
14		b.	Follows educational standards approved by the superintendent of public			
15			instruction;			
16		C.	Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements;			
17			and			
18		d.	Limits its enrollment to children who have reached the age of fourthree before			
19			August first in the year of enrollment.			
20	2.	In de	etermining the state aid payments to which a school district is entitled, the			
21		supe	erintendent of public instruction may not count any student enrolled in a regular			
22		early	y childhood education program.			
23	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
24	amended and reenacted as follows:					

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1	15.1	1-37-0	95. Early childhood education providers - Coalition - Eligibility.
2	1.	The	superintendent of a school district shall invite all public and private providers of
3		earl	y childhood education services within the district to meet, in order to:
4		a.	Initiate the identification of all available options for cost-effectively maximizing the
5			provision of early childhood education services within the district;
6		b.	Address the coordinated utilization of facilities, personnel, and transportation, for
7			the provision of early childhood education services within the district; and
8		C.	(1) Form a coalition of early childhood education service providers; and
9			(2) Provide for the selection of a coalition governing board.
10	2.	The	board of the school district in which the coalition of service providers is located
11		sha	I provide advice and guidance to the coalition in all matters pertaining to this
12		sect	ion through section 15.1-37-08.
13	3.	Any	early childhood service provider who agrees to participate in the coalition or on its
14		gov	erning board may submit an application to the departmentsuperintendent of
15		com	mercepublic instruction for a grant under this section, provided the governing
16		boa	rd certifies to the department that superintendent the provider:
17		a.	Is a participating member in the coalition or on the governing board.
18		b.	Operates an early childhood education program that:
19			(1) Is approved in accordance with section 15.1-37-01; and
20			(2) Incorporates within its curriculum at least ten hours of research-based
21			parental involvement.
22		C.	Has documented the provider's willingness to admit children of all learning
23			abilities into the early childhood education program.
24	SEC		3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amende	ed and	reenacted as follows:
26	15.1	1-37-0	6. Receipt and distribution of grants - Notification.
27	1.	<u>a.</u>	The departmentsuperintendent of commercepublic instruction shall receive
28			applications for and distribute grants under this section to eligible members,
29			including governing board members, of a consortium formed in accordance with
30			section 15.1-37-05, in the amount of two thousand dollars for each child enrolled
31			in a program of early childhood education, if the child is eligible for free lunches

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1		under the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act [42 U.S.C. 1751, et			
2		seq.], and one thousand dollars for each child enrolled in a program of early			
3		childhood education, if the child is eligible for reduced lunches under the Richard			
4		B. Russell National School Lunch Act [42 U.S.C. 1751, et seq.], provided:			
5	a .	(1) The child is a resident of this state; and			
6	b	(2) The child has reached the age of four before August first in the year of			
7		enrollment; and			
8		(3) The program has a duration of at least four hundred hours over a period of			
9		at least thirty-two consecutive weeks.			
10	<u>b</u> .	<u>A child enrolled in a federally funded head start program may not be counted for</u>			
11		the purpose of determining grant eligibility under this section.			
12	2. a.	Once each calendar quarter, at the time and in the manner required by the			
13		departmentsuperintendent of commercepublic instruction, any provider receiving			
14		a grant under this section shall forward to the parent of each child receiving			
15		services a notice indicating the total amount of the grant that was awarded to the			
16		provider for the quarter, the pro rata amount attributable to the parent's child, and			
17		the source of the grant. The departmentsuperintendent of commercepublic			
18		instruction shall standardize the notification required by this subdivision.			
19	b	If a provider fails to meet the notification requirements of this subsection, the			
20		departmentsuperintendent of commercepublic instruction shall reduce the			
21		amount of the provider's next grant payment by fifty percent. If a provider fails to			
22		meet the notification requirements of this section a second time, the			
23		departmentsuperintendent of commercepublic instruction shall determine that the			
24		provider is ineligible to participate in the grant program for a period of one year.	1		
25	SECTI	ON 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
26	amended a	ind reenacted as follows:			
27	15.1-37	7-08. Data collection - Requirements.			
28	The superintendent of public instruction, with the advice and consent of the department of				
29	commerce, shall implement a uniform system for the accounting, budgeting, and reporting of				
30	data by any	y early childhood education provider to whom or to which grants are distributed in			
31	accordance	e with section 15.1-37-06. Grants may be withheld or forfeited, in whole or in part, if			

- 1 information required in accordance with this section is not submitted at the time or in the
- 2 manner requested by the superintendent.
