A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation; to provide appropriations to the department of human services for behavioral health services; to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-44.1 and two new sections to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to management of inmate population, a community behavioral health plan as a term of parole or an alternative to incarceration, and prioritization of admission of inmates; to provide for a legislative management

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

study; and to provide for a report to the budget section.

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

- 16 2019-21 biennium. The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall report to the
- 17 appropriations committees of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time
- 18 funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

19 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.** There is

- appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, the sum of
- \$7,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services
- for the purpose of implementing the community behavioral health program, for the biennium
- beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The department is authorized six full-time
- 24 equivalent positions to implement the community behavioral health program.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT -

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

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1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purposes of contracting with a public or private entity to create, initiate, and facilitate the implementation of a strategic

- 1 plan to increase the availability of all types of behavioral health services in all regions 2 of the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 3 2. During the 2017-18 interim, the department of human services and the contracting 4 entity shall make annual reports to the legislative management on the status of the 5 creation and implementation of this strategic plan, including recommendations 6 regarding legislation needed for full implementation. 7 SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS 8 FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$935,907 of one-time 9 funding from the strategic investment and improvements fund for an electronic medical records 10 system. 11 SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 12 and enacted as follows: 13 Management of inmate population. 14 The governing body of a correctional facility, in cooperation with law enforcement, 1. 15 state's attorneys, and the judiciary in the judicial district in which the correctional 16 facility is located, shall develop an inmate population plan to prioritize admissions and 17 inmate retention based on the correctional facility's authorized budget. 18 <u>2.</u> The inmate population plan must take into consideration: 19 The governing body's authorized budget; <u>a.</u> 20 The inmate's offense; <u>b.</u> 21 Whether the inmate has been charged, adjudicated, or sentenced; <u>C.</u> 22 Whether the inmate presents a risk of flight or is a danger to others or self; d. 23 The inmate's medical needs and mental and behavioral health needs; and <u>e.</u> 24 <u>f.</u> Whether the inmate is subject to mandatory incarceration.

LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM 4 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall 5 consider continuing its study of alternatives to incarceration, with a focus on the behavioral 6 health needs of individuals in the criminal justice system. The study must include receipt of 7 reports on the status, effectiveness, and sustainability of the community behavioral health 8 program for individuals in the criminal justice system which must include caseload data, any 9 recognized savings to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, an overview of the 10 training requirements for contract behavioral health service providers, and recommendations. 11 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any 12 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly. 13 SECTION 10. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION - YOUTH 14 CORRECTIONAL CENTER STUDY - BUDGET SECTION REPORT. During the 2017-18 15 interim, the department of corrections and rehabilitation, in consultation with the department of 16 human services, the protection and advocacy project, and the supreme court, shall study the 17 potential for increased community-based treatment services for youth offenders, youth 18 correctional center staffing requirements, and the efficiency and adequacy of the youth 19 correctional center facilities. The study must consider the potential to raze and replace the

current facilities at the youth correctional center. The department of corrections and

rehabilitation shall report the results of the study to the budget section of the legislative
