1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 commerce; to provide exemptions; to provide for transfers; to provide for a report; and to

3 declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 9 department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, 10 as follows:

13 The 2017-19 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for

14 the 2019-21 biennium. The department of commerce shall report to the appropriations

15 committees of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

16 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 4. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the agricultural products utilization
 commission in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section

19 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item for grants are available for grants

during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the discretionary funds line item in
 section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017,
 and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 6. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the unmanned aircraft systems
 program in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section

54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this program are available during the biennium
beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 7. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for prekindergarten community grants
 in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any

1 unexpended funds from these grants are available for grants during the biennium beginning-2 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 3 SECTION 7. TRANSFER - INTERNSHIP FUND. The office of management and budget 4 shall transfer \$1,275,000\$750,000 of the amount appropriated in the operating expenses line 5 item in section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation 6 intern program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 7 2019. 8 **SECTION 8. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - BASE** 9 **RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM.** The grants line item and the estimated income line item in 10 section 1 of this Act include the sum of \$1,000,000\$200,000 from the strategic investment and 11 improvements fund for a base retention grant program to be developed by the department of 12 commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The grant 13 program must award direct grants and not cost reimbursement grants. The department may 14 award grants to each community with an air force base or air national guard facilities. 15 SECTION 9. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - UNMANNED 16 AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS PROGRAM. The grants line item and the estimated income line item in 17 section 1 of this Act include the sum of \$2,000,000 from the strategic investment and 18 improvements fund for operations of the unmanned aircraft systems test site, for the biennium 19 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 20 SECTION 10. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - ENHANCED 21 **USE LEASE GRANT PROGRAM.** The grants line item and the estimated income line item in 22 section 1 of this Act include the sum of \$3,000,000\$2,000,000 from the strategic investment and 23 improvements fund for an enhanced use lease grant program for the operations of the 24 unmanned aircraft systems test site, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending 25 June 30, 2019. Grants must be awarded for initiatives related to the unmanned aircraft system 26 industry in North Dakota, including for the purposes of infrastructure, research, development, 27 the creation of software, and the purchase of equipment benefiting the unmanned aircraft 28 system. The department of commerce shall require grant recipients to provide matching funds in 29 the form of cash, property, or in-kind consideration, totaling \$1,000,000 for the grants awarded 30 under this program. 1 SECTION 11. TRADE OFFICE - MATCHING FUND REQUIREMENT. The total North 2 Dakota trade office line item and the general fund appropriation in section 1 of this Act include 3 \$2,281,498\$1,781,498 of funding relating to the North Dakota trade office. The department of 4 commerce may spend seventy fifty percent of this amount without requiring any matching funds 5 from the trade office. Any additional amounts may be spent only to the extent the North Dakota 6 trade office provides one dollar of matching funds from private or other public sources for each 7 one dollar provided by the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending 8 June 30, 2019. Matching funds may include money spent by businesses or organizations to pay 9 salaries to export assistants, provide training to export assistants, or buy computer equipment 10 as part of the North Dakota trade office's export assistance program. 11 SECTION 12. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM. Section 1 of 12 this Act includes the sum of $\frac{1,500,000}{500}$, of which $\frac{1,350,000}{500}$ is from the 13 general fund and \$150,000 from special funds, for an entrepreneurship grants and voucher 14 program to be developed and administered by the department of commerce, for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The department shall establish guidelines to

16 provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified by the department. The department also shall

17 establish guidelines to award vouchers to entrepreneurs to procure business development

18 assistance from certified entrepreneurial centers or to provide grants to entrepreneurs working

with an entrepreneurial center. The amount appropriated for entrepreneurship grants in
section 1 of this Act is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this

21 line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 13. NORTH DAKOTA TOURISM PROGRAM - RESEARCH NORTH DAKOTA
 FUND. Notwithstanding section 54-65-08, the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act

includes \$500,000 from the research North Dakota fund for the North Dakota tourism program.
 SECTION 14. TRANSFER - RESEARCH NORTH DAKOTA FUND TO THE GENERAL
 FUND. Notwithstanding section 54-65-08, the office of management and budget shall transfer
 \$4,000,000 from the research North Dakota fund to the general fund, for the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 15. EMERGENCY. Funding of \$1,275,000\$750,000 in the operating expenses
 line item in sections 1 and 7 of this Act, relating to the operation intern program, are
 declared to be an emergency measure.
