1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 37-17.1 and a new section to

2 chapter 39-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the creation of a statewide

3 interoperability radio network fund and surcharges assessed for certain traffic violations; and to

4 provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide for a report.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 37-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7 and enacted as follows:

8	<u>Stat</u>	ewide interoperability radio network fund - Continuing appropriation.
9	<u>1.</u>	A fund known as the statewide interoperability radio network fund must be maintained
10		in the state treasury. Subject to statewide interoperability executive committee
11		approval, moneys in the fund must be used for providing the required state share of
12		funding for expenses associated with the purchase, installation, operation, and
13		maintenance of a statewide interoperability radio network. The fund consists of all
14		moneys transferred into the fund, interest on fund moneys, payments to the fund, and
15		other fund earnings.
16	<u>2.</u>	The chief information officer of the information technology department may apply for
17		and accept funds, grants, gifts, or services made available for the statewide
18		interoperability radio network by an agency or department of the federal government
19		or any other person. Any funds, grants, or gifts, or moneys received from services
20		received under this section must be placed in the statewide interoperability radio
21		network fund.
22	<u>3.</u>	Funds in the statewide interoperability radio network fund are appropriated on a
23		continuing basis and are available to the chief information officer solely for the purpose

1		of providing services for the purchase, installation, operation, and maintenance of a		
2		statewide interoperability radio network.		
3	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 39-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
4	and ena	cted as follows:		
5	<u>Sur</u>	charge assessed for certain violations.		
6	<u>1.</u>	In addition to any other penalty, an individual charged with a violation listed in section		
7		39-06.1-05 must be assessed a surcharge of one hundred dollars whichin an amount		
8		equal to the fine imposed. The surcharge must be deposited in the statewide		
9		interoperability radio network fund.		
10	<u>2.</u>	In addition to any fees under section 39-06.1-06, an individual charged with a		
11		noncriminal violation must be assessed a surcharge of forty dollars whichin an amount		
12		equal to the fine imposed. The surcharge must be deposited in the statewide		
13		interoperability radio network fund.		
14	<u>3.</u>	The clerk of court shall deposit with the state treasurer any surcharge collected under		
15		this section.		
16	SECTION 3. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE - REPORT. Before			
17	September 1, 2018, the statewide interoperability executive committee shall provide to the			
18	information technology committee a report regarding the implementation plan for a statewide			
19	interoperable radio network. The statewide interoperability executive committee shall engage			
20	appropriate stakeholders and include in the report any realized fiscal efficiencies as well as any			
21	reasonably foreseeable potential opportunities for additional fiscal efficiencies that could be			
22	achieved while not sacrificing the core requirements of the statewide interoperable radio			
23	network. An amount, not to exceed fifty thousand dollars, from the statewide interoperability			
24	radio network fund, is available to the chief information officer of the information technology			
25	department in order to fulfill these reporting requirements for the biennium beginning July 1,			
26	2017, and ending June 30, 2019.
