- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-27-03.1 and 15.1-27-04.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the determination of state aid payable to school districts.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-27-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-27-03.1. (Effective through June 30, 2017) Weighted average daily membership -

Determination.

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- 1. For each school district, the superintendent of public instruction shall multiply by:
- a. 1.00 the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in an extended
 educational program in accordance with section 15.1-32-17;
- b. 0.60 the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in a summer education
 program, including a migrant summer education program;
 - c. 0.33 the number of full-time equivalent students who:
 - (1) On a test of English language proficiency approved by the superintendent of public instruction are determined to be least proficient and placed in the first of six categories of proficiency; and
 - (2) Are enrolled in a program of instruction for English language learners;
 - d. 0.25 the number of full-time equivalent students under the age of twenty-one enrolled in grades nine through twelve in an alternative high school;
 - e. 0.22 the number of full-time equivalent students who:
 - On a test of English language proficiency approved by the superintendent of public instruction are determined to be more proficient than students placed in the first of six categories of proficiency and therefore placed in the second of six categories of proficiency; and

In 2016-172018-19, the superintendent shall multiply the district's weighted 7 student units by nine thousand six hundred forty-six dollars. 8 The superintendent shall adjust the product to ensure that the product is at 9 least equal to the greater of: 10 One hundred eight percent of the district's baseline funding per 11 weighted student unit, as established in subsection 2, multiplied by 12 the district's 2014-15-weighted student units from the previous school 13 year; or 14 One hundred percent of the district's baseline funding as established (b) 15 in subsection 1. 16 (2) The superintendent <u>also</u> shall also adjust the product to ensure that the 17 product does not exceed one hundred forty percent of the district's baseline 18 funding per weighted student unit, as established in subsection 2, multiplied 19 by the district's 2014-15 weighted student units from the previous school 20 <u>vear</u>. 21 After determining the product in accordance with subsection 3, the superintendent of 22 public instruction shall: 23 Subtract an amount equal to sixty mills multiplied by the taxable valuation of the a. 24 school district, provided that after 2013, except the amount in dollars subtracted 25 for purposes of this subdivision may not exceed the previous year's amount in 26 dollars subtracted for purposes of this subdivision by more than twelve percent; 27 and 28 b. Subtract an amount equal to seventy-five percent of all revenues listed in 29 paragraphs 1 through 5, and 7 of subdivision f of subsection 1 and one hundred 30 percent of all revenues listed in paragraphs 6, 8, and 9 of subdivision f of 31 subsection 1.

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- The amount remaining after the computation required under subsection 4 is the
 amount of state aid to which a school district is entitled, subject to any other statutory
- 3 requirements or limitations.
