- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-05.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to filings required for lobbyists; to amend and reenact subsection 1 of
- 3 section 54-05.1-02, and sections 54-05.1-03 and 54-05.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to lobbyist disclosure forms; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 54-05.1-02 of the North Dakota

- 7 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 1. This chapter applies to any person who, in any manner whatsoever, directly or
 9 indirectly, performs any of the following activities:
- 10 a. Attempts to secure the <u>introduction</u>, passage, amendment, or defeat of any
 11 legislation by the legislative assembly or the approval or veto of any legislation by
 12 the governor of the state.
- b. Attempts to influence decisions made by <u>an individual legislator, a legislative</u>
 <u>committee</u>, the legislative management, or by an interim committee of the
 legislative management.

16 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-05.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

54-05.1-03. Registration as a lobbyist - Fee - Filing of information - Public inspection Certificate of registration.

a. Before engaging in any of the activities listed in section 54-05.1-02, an individual
 shall register with the secretary of state and receive a certificate of registration
 and a distinctive lobbyist identification badge that must be prominently worn by
 the lobbyist when engaged in any of the activities listed in section 54-05.1-02
 while on the capitol grounds. In lieu of wearing the official badge provided by the

1			secretary of state, a lobbyist may wear a reasonable reproduction of the official
2			badge that contains the name of the lobbyist and any of the following: the word
3			lobbyist, the registration number of the lobbyist, or the organization name of the
4			lobbyist in characters no smaller than one-quarter inch [6.35 millimeters]. If a
5			lobbyist's official badge is lost or destroyed, the lobbyist may obtain a duplicate
6			badge by applying to the secretary of state and paying a fee of ten dollars.
7		b.	The registrant shall state in writing:
8			(1) The registrant's full name and business address; and
9			(2) The name and address of any person upon whose behalf the registrant
10			appears, any person in whose interest the registrant appears or works, the
11			duration of the employment or appearances, and by whom the registrant is
12			paid or is to be paid.
13		C.	The registration period commences on July first and expires on June thirtieth of
14			the following calendar year unless an earlier expiration date is requested by the
15			registrant.
16		d.	Each lobbyist shall file with the secretary of state, before the issuance of a
17			certificate of registration, a written authorization to act as a lobbyist. The
18			authorization must be signed by the official of the corporation, limited liability
19			company, association, group, or organization employing the lobbyist and may be-
20			filed by facsimile transmission.
21		e.	The secretary of state shall charge a fee of twenty-five dollars for registering
22			each lobbyist and the first person represented by the lobbyist and an additional
23			fee of fifteen dollars for each subsequent person represented by the lobbyist.
24	2.	Eac	ch lobbyist shall file, on or before AugustJuly first following the expiration of the
25		regi	istration period, with the secretary of state a detailed report. The report must
26		incl	ude the name of the lobbyist, the person the lobbyist represents, and a statement
27		as t	to each expenditure, if any, of sixty dollars or more expended on any single
28		occ	asion on any individual, including the spouse or other family member of a member
29		of tl	he legislative assembly or the governor, in carrying out the lobbyist's work or
30		incl	ude a statement that no reportable expenditures were made during the reporting
31		per	iod. Reportable expenditures include meals, beverages, gifts, conference and

1		event registrations, entertainment and sports tickets, and travel. The report must			
2		include reportable expenditures made by the lobbyist, regardless of whether the			
3		lobbyist or another person, including the employer of the lobbyist or any organization			
4		that contracted with the lobbyist, provided the funds for the expenditure. The			
5		statement of each expenditure must include a description of the nature of the			
6		expenditure, the amount of the expenditure, the date of the expenditure, and the name			
7		of the recipient or beneficiary of the expenditure. A state official or agency may not			
8		require reporting of lobbyist expenditures other than is required under this subsection.			
9		The secretary of state shall provide a prescribed form for reporting under this chapter.			
10		The secretary of state shall charge and collect fees for late filing of the detailed			
11		expenditure report as follows:			
12		a. Within sixty days after the date provided in this subsection for filing the detailed			
13		expenditure report, twenty-five dollars; and			
14		b. Thereafter, fifty dollars.			
15	3.	If a lobbyist fails to file a detailed expenditure report and pay any late fee by October-			
16		first, the lobbyist's registration is automatically revoked. The lobbyist's registration may-			
17		be reinstated if the lobbyist thereafter files the detailed expenditure report and pays-			
18		any outstanding late fee.			
19	4.	All information required to be filed under this section with the secretary of state and			
20		that previously filed must be compiled by the secretary of state within forty days after			
21		the close of the period for which the information is filed and the files must be open and			
22		accessible for public inspection during the normal working hours.			
23	3 SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 54-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and				
24		enacted as follows:			
25	Requirements for lobbyist filings - Penalty for late filings.				
26	<u>1.</u>	Any registration, written authorization, report, or statement required by this chapter to			
27		be filed with the secretary of state must be filed electronically in the format established			
28		by the secretary of state. If the secretary of state does not receive a required			
29		registration, written authorization, report, or statement, an electronic duplicate of the			
30		statement must be promptly filed upon notice by the secretary of state that the			
31		document was not received. After a document has been filed, the secretary of state

1		may	y request or accept written clarification along with an amended statement from the		
2		lobi	byist filing the document if discrepancies, errors, or omissions on the document are		
3		<u>disc</u>	covered. When requesting an amended document, the secretary of state shall		
4		<u>esta</u>	ablish a reasonable period of time, not to exceed ten days, for filing the amended		
5		<u>doc</u>	zument.		
6	<u>2.</u>	<u>In d</u>	In determining the amount of expenditures to a recipient, all amounts expended to or		
7		for	the benefit of the recipient during the reporting period must be aggregated to report		
8		an o	overall total expenditure for the purposes of the statements required by this		
9		<u>cha</u>	apter.		
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>For</u>	a reportable expenditure for which the lobbyist was a conduit who expended		
11		anc	other person's funds, the lobbyist shall identify each person that provided the funds		
12		<u>that</u>	t were expended.		
13	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	e secretary of state shall provide a system for lobbyists to register and report on the		
14		inte	ernet. Any statement and data filed with the secretary of state must be made		
15		<u>ava</u>	ilable on the internet to the public free of charge within twenty-four hours after		
16		<u>filin</u>	filing.		
17	<u>5.</u>	<u>The</u>	e secretary of state shall charge and collect fees for late filing of any document		
18		req	uired to be filed under this section as follows:		
19		<u>a.</u>	Within sixty days after the date provided in this chapter for filing the detailed		
20			expenditure report, one hundred dollars; and		
21		<u>b.</u>	Thereafter, five hundred dollars.		
22	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 54-05.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
23	amende	ed and	d reenacted as follows:

27		a.	Grant a certificate of registration and design and furnish a distinctive lobbyist

30		b.	Revoke the certificate of registration of any individual who has been convicted of		
31			violating any provision of this chapter.

1		C.	Refer on the secretary of state's own motion or on the verified complaint of any
2			other person, to the attorney general for investigation, the activities of any
3			individual who the secretary of state has reason to believe has been acting as a
4			lobbyist and who may be in violation of this chapter.
5		d.	Make available upon request of any citizen expenditures by categories reported
6			by registered lobbyists to have been expended on each individual in carrying out
7			that registrant's work.
8		e.	Supply a current list of registered lobbyists for each legislator upon request.
9	2.	The secretary of state may revoke the certificate of registration issued under this	
10		cha	pter for failure to file the reports required by this chapter when due, but no
11		cert	ificate may be revoked if, before the last day for filing the reports, the secretary of
12		state	e has been informed in writing of extenuating circumstances justifying the failure.
13	3.	The secretary of state shall compile and make available to the public a report of the	
14		tota	amount of expenditures reported by registrants.
15	4 .	The	secretary of state may establish procedures for registration of lobbyists and filing
16		of lo	bbyist expenditure reports through the internet or other electronic means, and may-
17		mak	e lobbyist expenditure reports available on the secretary of state's internet
18		web	site. If a certificate of registration is revoked, the person who authorized the
19		lobb	pyist may not register a new lobbyist for six months.
