- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 36-21.2 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the humane treatment of former research animals.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 36-21.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

 "Animal rescue organization" means any nonprofit organization that has.

- b. "Animal shelter" means any nonprofit organization that provides housing and
 care for animals directly, or through agreements with third parties, and the
 purpose of which is finding permanent homes for animals through adoption.

 16 <u>individual seeking to adopt a retired animal.</u>
- 17d."Research facility" means a higher education institution research facility that18receives public funding or is tax-exempt, a facility that provides research in19collaboration with a higher education facility, or any other facility that conducts20experiments on dogs or cats for scientific, testing, educational, or research
- 21 <u>purposes.</u>
- e. "Retired animal" means a dog or cat that was previously used or held for
 scientific, testing, educational, or research purposes and is no longer needed by

1			the research facility, and has no substantial medical conditions preventing the
2			safe adoption of the animal.
3	<u>2.</u>	A research facility, or an employee or student of a research facility, which confines and	
4		uses	s dogs or cats for scientific, testing, educational, or research purposes, upon
5		retiring the animal shall:	
6		<u>a.</u>	Offer the animal to an animal rescue organization or animal shelter for adoption
7			before euthanizing the animal; or
8		<u>b.</u>	Offer the animal for adoption through private placement before euthanizing the
9			animal.
10	<u>3.</u>	<u>lf an</u>	animal rescue organization or animal shelter agrees to accept a retired animal
11		from a research facility under subsection 2, the research facility and the animal rescue	
12		organization or animal shelter shall enter a written agreement to transfer the animal	
13		and implement the requirements of this section.
