## **HOUSE BILL NO. 1371**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-62 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a licensure grandfathering provision; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-62-01, 43-62-04, 43-62-09, 43-62-14, 43-62-15, 43-62-17, and 43-62-19 of the
- 4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation and licensure of medical imaging and
- 5 radiation therapy practitioners.

### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **43-62-01. Definitions.**
- 10 1. "Board" means the North Dakota medical imaging and radiation therapy board of examiners.
- "Certification organization" means a national certification organization that specializes
   in the certification and registration of certification of medical imaging and radiation
- 14 therapy technical personnel and which has programs accredited by the national
- 15 commission for certifying agencies, American national standards institute or the
- 16 international organization for standardization, or other accreditation organization
- 17 recognized by the board.
- 3. "Licensed practitioner" means a licensed physician, <u>physician assistant</u>, advanced
   practice registered nurse, surgeon, <u>certified registered nurse anesthetist</u>, chiropractor,
   dentist, or podiatrist.
- 21 4.3. "Licensee" means an individual licensed by the board to perform medical imaging or radiation therapy procedures and operate medical imaging or radiation therapy equipment, including a nuclear medicine technologist, radiation therapist,
- 24 radiographer, radiologist assistant, or sonographer.

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- 5.4. "Medical imaging" means the performance of anya diagnostic or interventional
   procedure or operation of medical imaging equipment as described in this chapter and
   intended for use in the diagnosis or visualization of disease or other medical
   conditions in human beings, including fluoroscopy, nuclear medicine, sonography, or
   x-rays.
- 6 6.5. "Medical physicist" means an individual who is certified by the American board of
  7 radiology, American board of medical physics, American board of science in nuclear
  8 medicine, or Canadian college of physics in medicine in radiological physics or one of
  9 the subspecialties of radiological physics.
- 10 "Registration organization" means a national organization that specializes in the 6. 11 registration of medical imaging and radiation therapy personnel, including the 12 American registry of radiologic technologists, international society for clinical 13 densitometry, nuclear medicine technology certification board, certification board of 14 radiology practitioner assistants. American registry for diagnostic medical sonography. 15 cardiovascular credentialing international, or other organization that specializes in the 16 registration of medical imaging and radiation therapy personnel recognized by the 17 board.
  - 7. "Radiation therapy" means the performance of any procedure or operation of radiation therapy equipment <u>as described in this chapter and</u> intended for use in the treatment of disease or other medical conditions in human beings.
  - 8. "Radiation therapist" means a nonphysician licensed by the board to perform radiation therapy procedures and operate radiation therapy equipment.
  - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-62-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 43-62-04. North Dakota medical imaging and radiation therapy board of examiners.

- 1. The governor shall appoint a state board of medical imaging and radiation therapy medical examiners consisting of nine members including:
  - a. Five medical imaging or radiation therapy professionals, one each from the areas of radiography, radiation therapy, nuclear medicine technology, sonography, and medical imaging or radiation therapy education;
  - b. One radiologist;

4	2.	2. Each medical imaging or radiation therapy member of the board must:		
5		a.	Be a practicing medical imaging or radiation therapy licensee of integrity and

8			imaging or radiation therapy modality in this stateby the board.	
9		C.	Be currently certified by a nationally recognized certification organization in the	
10			member's medical imaging or radiation therapy modality.	
11		<del>d.</del>	Have been engaged in the active practice of the medical imaging or radiation	
12			therapy profession within this state for a period of at least five years.	
13	3.	Eacl	h public member of the board must:	
14		a.	Be a resident of this state.	
15		b.	Be at least twenty-one years of age.	
16		C.	Not be affiliated with any group or profession that provides or regulates health	
17			care.	
18	4.	4. The radiologist, medical physicist, and physician members of the board must:		
19		a.	Be a practicing radiologist, medical physicist, or physician of integrity and ability.	
20		b.	Be a resident of and be licensed to practice as a physician or registered as a	
21			medical physicist in this state.	
22	5.	An i	ndividual appointed to the board shall qualify by taking the oath required of civil	
23		offic	ers.	
24	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
25	amended and reenacted as follows:			
26	43-62-09. Powers of the board.			
27	In addition to any other <del>powers</del> <u>duties</u> , the board may:			
28	1.	1. Administer this chapter.

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1 Adopt rules as may be necessary to carry out this chapter. After collaborating and 2 consulting with North Dakota medical imaging or radiation therapy organizations, 3 licensees, the North Dakota hospital association, and other affected parties. 4 <del>4.</del>3. Employ and fix the compensation of personnel the board determines necessary to 5 carry into effect this chapter and incur other expenses necessary to effectuate this 6 chapter. 7 <del>5.</del>4. Issue, renew, deny, suspend, or revoke licenses and carry out any disciplinary actions 8 authorized by this chapter. 9 <del>6.</del>5. Set fees for licensure, license renewal, and other services deemed necessary to carry 10 out the purposes of this chapter. 11 <del>7.</del>6. Conduct investigations for the purpose of determining whether violations of this 12 chapter or grounds for disciplining licensees exist. 13 <del>8.</del> Develop standards and adopt rules for the improvement of the administration of 14 medical imaging or radiation therapy procedures in this state. 15 9. Employ or contract with one or more certification organizations known to provide 16 acceptable examinations leading to certification of technical personnel performing-17 medical imaging or radiation therapy procedures. 18 <del>10.</del>7. Impose sanctions, deny licensure, levy fines, or seek appropriate civil or criminal 19 penalties against anyone who violates or attempts to violate examination security, 20 anyone who obtains or attempts to obtain licensure by fraud or deception, or anyone 21 who knowingly assists in that type of activity. 22 Require information on an applicant's or licensee's fitness, qualifications, and previous <del>11.</del>8. 23 professional record and performance from recognized data sources, licensing and 24 disciplinary authorities of other jurisdictions, certification registration organizations, 25 professional education and training institutions, liability insurers, health care 26 institutions, and law enforcement agencies be reported to the board. The board or its 27 investigative panels may require an applicant for licensure or a licensee who is the

12	SEC	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 43-62 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
13	and enacted as follows:			
14	Grandfathered licensees.			
15	Notwithstanding sections 43-62-14 and 43-62-15, the board shall issue a license to an			
16	applicant who, as of December 31, 2015, was employed in this state to perform medical			
17	imaging or radiation therapy procedures on live humans for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes.			
18	A licensee holding a license issued under this section may perform the medical imaging and			
19	radiation therapy modalities the licensee was employed to perform as of December 31, 2015.			
20	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
21	amended and reenacted as follows:			
22	43-62-14. License requirements.			
23	1.	The board may issue a license to any applicant who has submitted satisfactory		
24		evidence, verified by oath or affirmation, that the applicant:		
25		a. At the time of the application is at least eighteen years of age.		
26		b. Has successfully completed a four-year course of study in a secondary school-		
27		approved by the state board of higher education or passed an approved-		
28		equivalency test s currently registered with a registration organization.		
29	2.	In addition to the requirements of subsection 1, an individual seeking to obtain a		
30		license for a specific modality of medical imaging or radiation therapy shall comply		
31		with the following requirements:		

1 Provide satisfactory completion of a course of study in radiography, radiation-2 therapy, nuclear medicine technology, radiologist assistant, or sonography, or its-3 equivalent to be determined by the board. The curriculum for each course of 4 study may not be less stringent than the standards approved by the joint review-5 committee on education in radiologic technology, joint review committee on 6 nuclear medicine technology, commission on accreditation of allied health-7 education programs, or any other appropriate accreditation agency approved by 8 the board, provided the standards are not in conflict with board policy. 9 <del>b.</del> Pass a certification examination established or approved by the board given by a 10 certification organization recognized by the board. 11 Show evidence of compliance with continuing education or recertification 12 requirements required for registration of certification by a certification-13 organization recognized by the board. 14 <del>3.</del> The board, upon application and payment of proper fees, may grant a license to an 15 individual who has been licensed, certified, or registered to perform or administer 16 medical imaging or radiation therapy procedures in another jurisdiction if that 17 jurisdiction's standards of licensure are substantially equivalent to those provided in 18 this chapter in accordance with rules adopted by the board. 19 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-62-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 43-62-15. Scope of practice. 22 The board shall establish licensure standards for the following medical imaging and 23 radiation therapy modalities: 24 Nuclear medicine technologist. <del>a.</del> 25 <del>b.</del> Radiation therapist. 26 Radiographer. <del>C.</del> 27 <del>d.</del> Radiologist assistant. 28 Sonographer. e. 29 2. An individual holding a license under this chapter may perform medical imaging or 30 radiation therapy procedures on humans for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes only by written, 31 facsimile, electronic, or verbal prescription of an individual authorized by this state to prescribe

- 1 medical imaging or radiation therapy procedures and under the supervision of a licensed 2 practitioner.
- 3 <del>3.</del> An individual holding a license under this chapter may perform medical imaging and radiation therapy procedures on humans for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes only 5 within the scope of that license as specified under the rules adopted by the board.
- 6 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 8 43-62-17. Renewal.

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- A license issued under this chapter must be renewed before January second every two years. The license must be renewed upon the payment of a renewal fee if the licensee is not in violation of this chapter and has complied with any continuingeducationthe requirements adopted by rule of the boardthis chapter.
- 2. The board shall notify a licensee at least thirty days in advance of the expiration of the licensee's license. The licensee shall inform the board of any change of the licensee's address. Each licensee is responsible for renewing the licensee's license before the expiration date. A license that is not renewed automatically lapses.
- The board may provide for the late renewal of an automatically lapsed license upon the payment of a reinstatement fee.
  - SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-62-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 21 43-62-19. Grounds for disciplinary action.

- 22 Disciplinary action may be imposed against a licensee upon any of the following grounds:
- 23 1. The use of any false, fraudulent, or forged statement or document, or the use of any 24 fraudulent, deceitful, dishonest, or immoral practice, in connection with any of the 25 licensing requirements.
- 26 2. The conviction of any misdemeanor determined by the board to have a direct bearing 27 upon an individual's ability to serve the public as a licensee or of any felony. A license 28 may not be withheld contrary to chapter 12.1-33.
  - 3. Habitual use of alcohol or drugs.
- 30 4. Physical or mental disability materially affecting the ability to perform the duties of a 31 medical imaging or radiation therapy professional in a competent manner.

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- The performance of any dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional conduct likely to
   deceive, defraud, or harm the public.
- Aiding or abetting the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy by anunlicensed, incompetent, or impaired individual.
- The violation of any provision of this chapter or any rule of the board, or any action,
   stipulation, limitation, condition, or agreement imposed by the board or its investigative
   panels.
- 8 8. The performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy under a false or assumed name.
- The willful or negligent violation of the confidentiality between medical imaging or
   radiation therapy professional and patient, except as required by law.
- 12 10. Gross negligence in the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy.
- 13 11. Sexual abuse, misconduct, or exploitation related to the licensee's performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy.
- 15 12. The use of any false, fraudulent, or deceptive statement in any document connected with the performance of medical imaging or radiation therapy.
  - 13. The failure to maintain in good standing, including completion of continuing education or recertification requirements, a certification from a nationally recognized certification organization recognized by the board for the medical imaging or radiation therapy modality for which a license has been issued by the board registration with a registration organization.
  - 14. The imposition by another state, jurisdiction, or certification organization recognized by the board of disciplinary action against a license, certificationregistration, or other authorization to perform medical imaging or radiation therapy based upon acts or conduct by the medical imaging or radiation therapy professional which would constitute grounds for disciplinary action under this section. A certified copy of the record of the action taken by the other state, jurisdiction, or certificationregistration organization is conclusive evidence of that action.
  - 15. The failure to furnish the board or the investigative panel or investigators or representatives of the board or investigative panel information legally requested by the

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- 1 board or the investigative panel. The board shall keep a record of its proceedings in a
- disciplinary action or refusal to issue a license, together with the evidence offered.
