4	SECTION 1. A	MENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 50-06-32 of the North Dakota Century
5	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8	(2)	The director of the department of human services, or the director's

10	(3)	The director of special education superintendent of public instruction, or the
11		director'ssuperintendent's designee; and
12	(4)	The executive director of the protection and advocacy project, or the
13		director's designee; and
14	b. The	following members appointed by the governor:
15	(1)	A pediatrician with expertise in the area of autism spectrum disorder;
16	(2)	A psychologist with expertise in the area of autism spectrum disorder;
17	(3)	A college of education faculty member with expertise in the area of autism
18		spectrum disorder;
19	(4)	A behavioral specialist;
20	<u>(5)</u>	_A licensed teacher with expertise in the area of autism spectrum disorder;
21	(5) (6)	An occupational therapist;
22	(6) (7)	A representative of a health insurance company doing business in this state;
23	(7)<u>(8)</u>	A representative of a licensed residential care facility forthat provides care
24		and services to individuals with autism spectrum disorder;

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1	(8)(9) <u>A representative who is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian</u>
2	tribe;
3	(10) An adult self advocate;
4	(11) A parent of a child with autism spectrum disorder;
5	(9)(12) A family member of an adult with autism spectrum disorder; and
6	(10)(13) A member of the legislative assembly:
7	(11) A native American representing native Americans with autism spectrum
8	disorder; and
9	(12) An adult with autism spectrum disorder.
