SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION

BILL NO: Engrossed HB 1137 w/ Senate Amendments

BILL DESCRIPTION: General Contractor Liability/Cease and Desist Order

SUMMARY OF ACTUARIAL INFORMATION: Workforce Safety & Insurance, together with its actuarial firm, Bickerstaff, Whatley, Ryan & Burkhalter Consulting Actuaries, has reviewed the legislation proposed in this bill in conformance with Section 54-03-25 of the North Dakota Century Code.

The proposed legislation establishes WSI's method of calculating premiums in the event an employer does not provide a payroll report or a non-complying employer fails to provide reliable payroll information; relocates the general contractor liability statute from the definitions section to its own statute; limits the liability of the general contractor for premiums not paid by a subcontractor or independent contractor to only the work performed under that general contractor; establishes method for WSI to determine premium in the absence of reliable payroll information; creates a new section allowing WSI to issue a cease and desist order and notice of hearing in the event an employer is operating without workers' compensation coverage; and establishes a penalty for those persons employing workers in violation of a cease and desist order in the amount of \$10,000 plus \$100 per day for each day the violation continues.

FISCAL IMPACT: No significant impact to statewide premium rate levels is anticipated.
