- 2 to hospital discharge policies. for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-16 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hospital discharge policies.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. Chapter 23-49 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as			
6	follows:			
7	<u> 23-49-01. Definitions.</u>			
8	<u>As used in this chapter:</u>			
9	<u>— 1. "Aftercare" means assistance related to a patient's condition at the time of discharge</u>			
10	provided by an uncompensated caregiver to a patient after the patient's discharge.			
11	The term may include assistance with activities of daily living, instrumental activities of			
12	daily living, or medical or nursing tasks.			
13	<u>2. "Discharge" means a patient's release from a hospital following the patient's admission</u>			
14	to the hospital.			
15	<u>3. "Uncompensated caregiver" means an individual who, at the request of a patient,</u>			
16	agrees to provide, without compensation, aftercare to the patient in the patient's			
17	residence.			
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20	discharge policies must include:			
21	a. Assessment of the patient's ability for self-care after discharge.			
22	<u>b.</u> Opportunity for the patient to designate an uncompensated caregiver.			
23	<u><u>c.</u> <u>Documentation of an uncompensated caregiver designated by a patient.</u></u>

1	<u>d.</u> Notification of the designated uncompensated caregiver of the patient's discharge
2	or transfer to another facility.
3	e. Opportunity for the patient and designated uncompensated caregiver to
4	participate in discharge planning.
5	<u>f. Opportunity for instruction and training for the patient and designated</u>
6	uncompensated caregiver before discharge for the uncompensated caregiver to
7	perform aftercare.
8	g. Documentation of the details of the discharge plan.
9	<u>2. The discharge policies may incorporate established standards, such as:</u>
10	a. Standards for accreditation adopted by a nationally recognized hospital
11	accreditation organization; or
12	<u><u>b.</u> The conditions of participation for hospitals and for critical access hospitals</u>
13	adopted by the centers for medicare and medicaid services.
14	<u>23-49-03. Limitations - Immunity.</u>
15	<u>1. This chapter may not be construed to interfere with the rights of an agent operating</u>
16	under a valid health care directive under chapter 23-06.5.
17	<u>2. This chapter does not require a hospital to adopt discharge policies that would delay a</u>
18	patient's discharge or transfer to another facility or require the disclosure of protected
19	health information without obtaining a patient's consent as required by state and
20	federal laws governing health information privacy and security.
21	<u>3. This chapter does not require a patient designate an uncompensated caregiver.</u>
22	<u>4. This chapter does not create a private right of action against a hospital or a hospital's</u>
23	employee, contractor, or duly authorized agent for providing the instruction and
24	services required under this chapter.
25	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 23-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
26	and enacted as follows:
27	Hospital discharge policies - Uncompensated caregivers.
28	1. As used in this section:
29	a. "Aftercare" means assistance related to a patient's condition at the time of
30	discharge provided by an uncompensated caregiver to a patient after the

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1		patient's discharge. The term may include assistance with activities of daily living,
2		instrumental activities of daily living, or medical or nursing tasks.
3		b. "Discharge" means a patient's release from a hospital following the patient's
4		admission to the hospital.
5		c. "Uncompensated caregiver" means an individual who, at the request of a patient,
6		agrees to provide, without compensation, aftercare to the patient in the patient's
7		residence.
8	2.	A hospital shall establish and maintain written discharge policies in accordance with
9		the medicare and medicaid conditions of participation. The discharge policies apply to
10		all patients of the hospital, regardless of whether the patient receives medicare or
11		medicaid.
12	3.	A patient or a patient's guardian may identify an uncompensated caregiver.
13	4.	This section may not be construed to interfere with the rights of an agent operating
14		under a valid health care directive under chapter 23-06.5.
