1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to access to confidential records by the commission on legal counsel for  
3 indigents.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.** Subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
6 and enacted as follows:

7 4. Notwithstanding any provision of law making the records confidential, in addition to or  
8 in lieu of a subpoena, in determining eligibility for public defender services the  
9 commission may obtain access, including automated access in the case of records  
10 maintained in automated databases, to:

11 a. Records of other state and local government agencies, including:

12 (1) Vital statistics, including records of marriage, birth, and divorce;

13 (2) Local tax and revenue records, including information on residence address,  
14 employer, income, and assets;

15 (3) Records concerning real and titled personal property;

16 (4) Records of occupational and professional licenses and records concerning  
17 the ownership and control of corporations, partnerships, and other business  
18 entities;

19 (5) Employment security records;

20 (6) Workforce safety and insurance records identifying the last-known address  
21 of an individual, wage-loss benefits, permanent partial impairment benefits,  
22 death benefits, or additional benefits that individual has received or is  
23 entitled to receive from the organization, and whether and where that  
24 individual is employed;

- 1                   (7) Records of all agencies administering public assistance programs;
- 2                   (8) Records of the department of transportation, which access is not subject to
- 3                   the requirements in section 39-16-13;
- 4                   (9) Corrections records;
- 5                   (10) Law enforcement records; and
- 6                   (11) Subject to an agreement with the state tax commissioner, state tax and
- 7                   revenue records, including information on residence address, employer,
- 8                   income, and assets; and
- 9           b. Certain information contained in records held by private entities, subject to
- 10           safeguards on privacy and information security, consisting of:
- 11                   (1) The name, address, social security number, and other requested relevant
- 12                   income or asset information of the individual and the name and address of
- 13                   the employer of the individual, as appearing in customer records of public
- 14                   utilities, including cellular and wireless telephone service providers and
- 15                   cable television companies, pursuant to an administrative subpoena if
- 16                   requested; and
- 17                   (2) Information on assets and liabilities of the individual held by financial
- 18                   institutions.
