- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsections 4 and 5 to section 54-61-02 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to access to confidential records by the commission on legal
- 3 counsel for indigents.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows: 7 Notwithstanding any provision of state law making the records confidential, but subject 8 to any prohibitions in federal law, in addition to or in lieu of a subpoena, in determining 9 eligibility for public defender services the commission may obtain access, including 10 automated access in the case of records maintained in automated databases, to: 11 a. All records of other state and local government agencies, including: 12 <u>(1)</u> Vital statistics, including records of marriage, birth, and divorce; 13 Local tax and revenue records, including information on residence address, (2) 14 employer, income, and assets; 15 Records concerning real and titled personal property; <u>(3)</u> 16 (4) Records of occupational and professional licenses and records concerning 17 the ownership and control of corporations, partnerships, and other business 18 entities; 19 (5)**Employment security records**; 20 (6) Workforce safety and insurance records pursuant to a release signed by an 21 individual identifying the last-known address of the individual, wage-loss 22 benefits, permanent partial impairment benefits, death benefits, or additional 23 benefits that individual has received or is entitled to receive from the

organization, and whether and where that individual is employed;
