- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06.4 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a brain injury advisory council; and to provide for
- 3 application.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 50-06.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 Brain injury advisory council.

- 8 <u>1.</u> The governor shall appoint at least five, but no more than nine, members to serve on
 9 the brain injury advisory council as follows:
- 10 <u>a.</u> <u>One brain injury survivor, nominated by the council;</u>
- 11 <u>b.</u> <u>One family member of a brain injury survivor, nominated by the council;</u>
- 12 <u>c.</u> At least one service provider who provides services to brain injury survivors,
 13 <u>nominated by the council;</u>
- 14d.An individual representing the Indian affairs commission, nominated by the Indian15affairs commission; and
- 16e.At least one individual representing a religious, charitable, fraternal, civic,17educational, legal, veteran, welfare, or professional group or organization.
- 18 <u>2.</u> <u>The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint one member of the house of</u>
- 19 representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall appoint one
- 20 member of the senate to serve as members of the council. The legislative members-
- 21 <u>serve at the pleasure of the chairman of the legislative management.</u> Each legislative
- 22 member of the council is entitled to receive compensation from the legislative council
- 23 for each day spent in meetings of the council and for reimbursement for related travel
- 24 and other necessary expenses in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.

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1	<u>3.</u>	Each of the following entities shall appoint a representative to serve as a nonvoting		
2		member of the council who serves at the pleasure of the appointing entity:		
3		<u>a.</u>	Protection and advocacy project, one representative;	
4		<u>b.</u>	State department of health, one individual representing injury prevention and one	
5			representative representing emergency medical services and trauma;	
6		<u>C.</u>	Department of human services, one individual representing behavioral health,	
7			one individual representing medicaid, one individual representing vocational	
8			rehabilitation, and one individual representing brain injuries; and	
9		<u>d.</u>	Department of public instruction, one representative.	
10	<u>4.</u>	The governor may appoint an individual representing stroke health to serve as a		
11		nony	voting member of the council who serves at the pleasure of the governor.	
12	<u>5.</u>	<u>A vo</u>	ting advisory council member appointed by the governor may not serve more than	
13		two	consecutive four-year terms on the council.	
14	<u>6.</u>	<u>A co</u>	uncil member appointed under subdivision a or b of subsection 1 is entitled to	
15		<u>rece</u>	ive from the department reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state	
16		<u>offic</u>	ers and per diem compensation as determined by the department if the member is	
17		<u>atter</u>	nding meetings or performing duties directed by the council.	
18	<u>7.</u>	<u>The</u>	council shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from the voting membership of	
19		the o	council and shall elect a secretary from the voting or nonvoting membership of the	
20		<u>cour</u>	ncil. The council shall meet quarterly. A majority of the voting members of the	
21		<u>cour</u>	ncil constitutes a quorum. The council shall adopt bylaws.	
22	<u>8.</u>	<u>The</u>	council shall advise the department and shall participate in activities to improve	
23		the o	quality of life for an individual with brain injury and the individual's family through	
24		<u>brair</u>	n injury awareness, prevention, research, education, collaboration, support	
25		<u>serv</u>	ices, and advocacy.	
26	<u>9.</u>	<u>The</u>	department shall provide the council with administrative support services.	
27	SECTION 2. APPLICATION. The governor shall stagger the initial terms of the brain injury			
28	advisory council so approximately half of the initial appointments made by the governor serve			
29	two-year terms and the remainder of the initial appointments serve four-year terms. For the			
30	initial appointments to the advisory council, the department of human services shall submit			
31	nominees in place of the council.
