1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision 3 services - school for the blind; to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-06 and a new 4 section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the blind 5 fund and the school for the deaf fund; to repeal section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century 6 Code and section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws, relating to a required transfer 7 from the Bank of North Dakota and a contingent appropriation; to provide exemptions; to 8 provide for a transfer; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an 9 emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows: Subdivision 1. 31	CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The	superintendent of public inst	ruction may		

- 1 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants special education line
- 2 items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that
- 3 were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by
- 4 the education provider until after June 30, 2017. To be reimbursed under this section, claims
- 5 must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public instruction by June 30,
- 6 2018.

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SECTION 9. GRANTS - SPECIAL EDUCATION DEFICIENCY AUTHORIZATION. If funds provided to the superintendent of public instruction in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for grants - special education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, are not sufficient to meet special education contract obligations, the superintendent of public

instruction shall request supplemental funding from the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.

SECTION 10. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.

- 1. The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units.
- 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

SECTION 11. TRANSPORTATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION.

1. During each year of the 2017-19 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall calculate the payment to which each school district is entitled based on the state transportation formula as it existed on June 30, 2001, except that the superintendent shall provide reimbursement at the rate of:

30	subdivision	1 of se	ection 1 of this Act includes \$1,735,000 for a program grant pool. The
31	superintend	ent of	public instruction shall use the funding provided for various grant programs,

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1 including up to \$75,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, for continuing education 2 grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 3 The superintendent of public instruction shall award continuing education grants in 4 amounts up to \$1,200 to eligible recipients in chronological order, based on the date of 5 an individual's application. An eligible recipient must: 6 (1) Be licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board; 7 (2) Have taught in this state during each of the last three school years; and 8 (3) Be enrolled at an institution of higher education in this state in either a 9 master of education program in educational leadership or a program leading 10 to a specialist diploma in educational leadership; 11 b. Be pursuing the requirements for a certificate in career development facilitation: 12 or 13 Be pursuing a school counselor credential. 14 If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of 15 public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shall 16 distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis, 17 according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district. 18 SECTION 13. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 19 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its 20 operating account. 21 SECTION 14. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in 22 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,737,528 for aid to public libraries, of which no 23 more than one-half may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. 24 SECTION 15. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL 25 FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item 26 in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be 27 deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state 28 treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly. 29 SECTION 16. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT

PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher

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- 1 education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or
- 2 hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys
- 3 appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed
- 4 pursuant to the provisions of this section:
- The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for
 which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly
 reimbursement.
 - To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the
 deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the
 amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf
 or hard of hearing.
 - 3. The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount appropriated during the first year of the biennium.
 - 4. If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level.
 - 5. At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education, the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs.

SECTION 17. PASSTHROUGH GRANTS - APPLICATION - DISTRIBUTION -

- **REPORTING.** The line item entitled grants passthrough grants included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,378,000 for passthrough grants. The superintendent of public
- instruction shall determine the manner in which each passthrough grant is distributed.
- 24 Grantees, as a condition of receiving the grant, must establish performance measures to be
- 25 reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction. Grantees shall report to the superintendent
- of public instruction regarding performance based on the measures before October 1, 2018.
- 27 The superintendent of public instruction shall report to the appropriations committees of the
- 28 sixty-sixth legislative assembly regarding funds granted, performance measures established for
- 29 each grantee, and whether grantees met performance expectations.
 - SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.
 - During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility

- 1 and desirability of combining services for any or all English language learner programs,
- 2 distance learning programs, regional education agencies, teacher center networks, adult
- 3 learning centers, career and technical education programs, education technology services,
- 4 continuing education for counselors, the North Dakota leadership in educational administration
- 5 development center, and the teacher mentoring program. The legislative management shall
- 6 report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement
- 7 the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.
- 8 **SECTION 19.** A new section to chapter 25-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 9 and enacted as follows:
- 10 School for the blind fund.
- The school for the blind fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
- 12 <u>pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, revenues received from</u>
- 13 services and leases, and contributions must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to
- 14 <u>be used pursuant to legislative appropriation for the provision of services under this chapter.</u>
- 15 **SECTION 20.** A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 16 and enacted as follows:
- 17 <u>School for the deaf fund.</u>
- The school for the deaf fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
- 19 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota and all revenues received
- 20 <u>from the lease of buildings and the provision of meals and services, including interpreter</u>
- 21 services, must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to
- 22 legislative appropriation for provision of services under this chapter.
- 23 **SECTION 21. REPEAL.** Section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
- 24 **SECTION 22. REPEAL.** Section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws is repealed.
- 25 **SECTION 23. EMERGENCY.** Sections 7 and 22 of this Act are declared to be emergency
- 26 measures.
