FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2015

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Appropriations Committee

A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation; to provide appropriations to the department of human services for behavioral health services; to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-44.1 and two new sections to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to management of inmate population, a community behavioral health plan as a term of parole or an alternative to incarceration, and prioritization of admission of inmates; to provide for legislative management studies; and to provide for a report to the budget section.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

SECTION 2. HEALTH INSURANCE INCREASE. The appropriation in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$2,150,275, of which \$2,010,808 is from the general fund, for increases in employee health insurance premiums from \$1,130 to \$1,241 per month.

4 SECTION 3. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO THE

5 SIXTY-SIXTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding

6 items approved by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly for the 2015-17 biennium and the

7 2017-19 biennium one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

20 The 2017-19 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for

21 the 2019-21 biennium. The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall report to the

22 appropriations committees of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time

funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. There is

appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, the sum of

\$7,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services

for the purpose of implementing the community behavioral health program, for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The department is authorized six full-time

equivalent positions to implement the community behavioral health program.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT -

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

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- 1 1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purposes of contracting with a public or private entity to create, initiate, and facilitate the implementation of a strategic plan to increase the availability of all types of behavioral health services in all regions of the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.
 - During the 2017-18 interim, the department of human services and the contracting entity shall make annual reports to the legislative management on the status of the creation and implementation of this strategic plan, including recommendations regarding legislation needed for full implementation.

11 SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS

- **FUND.** The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$935,907 of one-time funding from the strategic investment and improvements fund for an electronic medical records system.
- 15 SECTION 7. MISSOURI RIVER CORRECTIONAL CENTER HOUSING UNIT
- PURCHASE. The appropriation in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$844,000 for the
 purchase of a thirty-six bed housing unit at the Missouri River correctional center.
- SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Management of inmate population.

- The governing body of a correctional facility, in cooperation with law enforcement, state's attorneys, and the judiciary in the judicial district in which the correctional facility is located, shall develop an inmate population plan to prioritize admissions and inmate retention based on the correctional facility's authorized budget.
 - 2. The inmate population plan must take into consideration:
 - a. The governing body's authorized budget;
- <u>b.</u> <u>The inmate's offense;</u>
- c. Whether the inmate has been charged, adjudicated, or sentenced;
- d. Whether the inmate presents a risk of flight or is a danger to others or self:
- 30 e. The inmate's medical needs and mental and behavioral health needs; and
- 31 <u>f. Whether the inmate is subject to mandatory incarceration.</u>

1 The inmate population plan must include alternatives to physical custody of individuals 2 under charge or conviction of an offense. Potential alternatives to physical custody 3 include: 4 Placement in a community setting: a. 5 Work release: <u>b.</u> 6 Home detention; <u>C.</u> 7 Electronic home detention; d. 8 Global positioning system monitoring; <u>e.</u> 9 Medical, psychiatric, and drug and alcohol treatment; <u>f.</u> 10 Employment; <u>g.</u> 11 h. Pretrial risk assessment; and 12 Pretrial supervision. 13 This section does not apply when there are exigent circumstances that affect a <u>4.</u> 14 correctional facility's operations and inmate population, including acts of God and 15 mass arrests. 16 The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall provide technical assistance 5. 17 relating to the implementation of this section to the governing body of a correctional 18 facility upon request from the governing body. 19 SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 20 and enacted as follows: 21 Community behavioral health program - Reports to legislative management and 22 governor. 23 <u>1.</u> The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall establish and implement a 24 community behavioral health program to provide comprehensive community-based 25 services for individuals who have serious behavioral health conditions, as a term and 26 condition of parole under chapter 12-59, and as a sentencing alternative under section 27 12.1-32-02. 28 In developing the program under this section, the department of corrections and 29 rehabilitation shall collaborate with the department of human services to: 30 Establish a referral and evaluation process for access to the program. <u>a.</u>

29	SECTION 10. A new section to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
30	created and enacted as follows:				

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1 Prioritization of admission of inmates - Report to legislative management. 2 The department of corrections and rehabilitation may refuse to admit inmates sentenced to 3 the physical custody of the department when the admission of inmates will exceed the 4 maximum operational capacity of the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities and result in the 5 department exceeding its authorized legislative appropriation for contracting for housing 6 inmates in other correctional facilities. For purposes of this section, maximum operational 7 capacity of the department means the total number of inmates that may be imprisoned at the 8 same time in the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities. The department shall develop a prison 9 population management plan to prioritize admissions based on sentences and the availability of 10 space in the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities. The department shall report annually to the 11 legislative management on the prison population management plan and inmate admissions and 12 the number of inmates the department has not admitted after sentencing. 13 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM 14 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall 15 consider continuing its study of alternatives to incarceration, with a focus on the behavioral 16 health needs of individuals in the criminal justice system. The study must include receipt of 17 reports on the status, effectiveness, and sustainability of the community behavioral health 18 program for individuals in the criminal justice system which must include caseload data, any 19 recognized savings to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, an overview of the 20 training requirements for contract behavioral health service providers, and recommendations. 21 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any 22 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly. 23 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - TOMPKINS REHABILITATION 24 CENTER. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the 25 operation, management, conditions, caseload, and physical plant of the Tompkins rehabilitation 26 center at the state hospital. The study must include the potential transition of the Tompkins 27 rehabilitation center, including the transfer of the building, employees, and supervision and 28 management of all operations and caseload of the Tompkins rehabilitation center, from the 29 department of human services and the state hospital to the department of corrections and

rehabilitation. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations,

- 1 together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth
- 2 legislative assembly.
- 3 SECTION 13. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION YOUTH
- 4 CORRECTIONAL CENTER STUDY BUDGET SECTION REPORT. During the 2017-18
- 5 interim, the department of corrections and rehabilitation, in consultation with the department of
- 6 human services, the protection and advocacy project, and the supreme court, shall study the
- 7 potential for increased community-based treatment services for youth offenders, youth
- 8 correctional center staffing requirements, and the efficiency and adequacy of the youth
- 9 correctional center facilities. The study must consider the potential to raze and replace the
- 10 current facilities at the youth correctional center. The department of corrections and
- 11 rehabilitation shall report the results of the study to the budget section of the legislative
- 12 management by December 31, 2018.
