- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to eligibility for North Dakota scholarships.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 15.1-21-02.6. North Dakota scholarship - Amount - Applicability.

- 1. a. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship in the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars for each semester during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.
  - b. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each quarter during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.
- 2. The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining that a recipient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall provide notification to the student within ten days.
- 3. A student is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under this section.

A scholarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills 10 the requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who: 11 Graduates from a high school in this state; a. 12 Graduates from a high school in a bordering state under chapter 15.1-29; b. 13 Graduates from a nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a C. 14 custodial parent in this state; or 15 d. Completes a program of home education supervised in accordance with chapter 16 15.1-23. 17 7. For purposes of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, "full-time" a. 18 means enrollment in at least twelve credits during a student's first two semesters 19 and enrollment in at least fifteen credits during each subsequent semester 20 thereafter, or enrollment in at least fourteen credits during each subsequent 21 semester if the student is enrolled in a nursing program approved by the board of 22 nursing, or enrollment in the equivalent number of credits, as determined by the 23 state board of higher education, with respect to students in a quarter system. 24 b. (1) If a student requires fewer than fifteen credits to graduate, or fewer than 25 fourteen credits to graduate if enrolled in a nursing program, the student 26 may retain scholarship eligibility by enrolling in fewer than fifteen credits, or 27 fewer than fourteen credits if enrolled in a nursing program, but at least 28 twelve credits during the semester, or the equivalent number of credits, as
