SB 2127 deals with refunds of local sales and use taxes.

SB 2127 provides a period of time for taxpayers to claim a refund for overpayment of local sales and uses taxes that exceed the cap put in place by local ordinance. If enacted, SB 2127 may change the timing of local sales tax refunds, in some cases speeding up the refunds that may otherwise have lagged into a later period. Although there may be a timing change, the net fiscal impact overall is zero.
