HB 1230 changes the calculation of duration of unemployment insurance benefits from 12-26 weeks to a straight 16 weeks. The change will not result in any additional revenue or appropriation. However, the change will result in a reduction in benefits paid from the unemployment insurance trust fund.

The bill changes the existing claim duration calculation for individuals receiving unemployment insurance benefits. The bill does not provide for any additional revenues and does not result in an appropriation request. There are two primary fiscal impacts; 1) impact upon unemployment insurance benefits paid from the unemployment insurance trust fund and, 2) an impact upon claimants receiving unemployment insurance benefits who may see a change in the maximum duration of their claim. Using an average of the prior four years data, it is expected that the trust fund will see a reduction in benefits paid of between \$3 and \$5 million dollars. The same data identified that 16,897 claimants would have seen no impact upon their claim duration, 5,627 would have seen an increase in their claim duration of between 2 and 4 weeks and 4,042 would have seen an decrease in their claim duration of between 2 and 10 weeks.
