REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE HOLMAN

MR. SPEAKER: And members of the Assembly. On St. Patrick's Day weekend, we saw lots of Green. In Minot at the State B Basketball tournament, green also won the day. In its first ever trip to the state basketball tournament, the Thompson Tommies after four close games, which includes the Region 2 championship over last year's state champion Hillsboro Central Valley (HCV), a quarterfinal win over Ellendale on Thursday, and an overtime win over Minot Ryan on Friday. In the championship game, which also went in to overtime, All Tournament team member, Hayden Overby had 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead number one ranked Thompson over Shiloh Christian, which was ranked number 2. Tournament MVP Cayden Schwabe continued his outstanding tournament performance with 15. Marcus Hughes had 10, Chance Danner 4, Jacob Dick 4 and Pierce Cooper 3. A balanced attack which led to their victory. Seventh year coach Brandy George, and NDHSA Coach of the Year, set up a game plan that played tough defense to take away the Shiloh Skyhawks best weapon, the three-point basket. In the semifinal game they made 14. With the 3-point weapon limited, they went to their 6-7 center Macauley Young. At the end of regulation, the game was tied at 45. Early in overtime, Young fouled Cadyn Schwabe on a 3 point shot, setting up three free throws, putting Thompson ahead. With Young's height no longer a factor, the lane opened up, allowing inside scoring opportunities for the Thompson offense and Hayden Overby took over. In the overtime, Shiloh scored 2 and Thompson scored 12 leading to a final score of 57-47. Congratulations to the Thompson Tommies for the school's first ever state Basketball championship which caps off a terrific year for Thompson athletes and coaches. A year that saw the school take home four state championships, for baseball, football and volleyball. Congratulations to the Thompson school and the entire community. Thank You Mr. Speaker.
