SECTION 3. TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT - SERIOUS MENTAL

ILLNESS. Beginning on or after October 1, 2019, the department of human services, medical services division, shall expand the types of providers recognized as medicaid providers of targeted case management of individuals with a serious mental illness. If the expansion results in expenditures that exceed the amount appropriated to the department of human services for this service, and the department of human services certifies this to the sixtyseventh legislative assembly, the department shall request deficiency funding for the purpose of expanding the types of providers recognized as Medicaid providers of targeted case management services for individuals with severe mental illness, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021."
