SECTION 2. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the 2019-21 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2019-21 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2021-23 biennium. The governor's office shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021."

54-07-04. Salary of governor.

The annual salary of the governor is ~~one hundred twenty-nine thousand ninety-one~~ one hundred thirty-five thousand six hundred twenty-three dollars through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and ~~one hundred thirty-two thousand nine hundred sixty-four~~ one hundred thirty-nine thousand six hundred ninety-two dollars thereafter.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 54-08-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-08-03. Salary of lieutenant governor.

The annual salary of the lieutenant governor is ~~one hundred thousand two hundred fifteen~~ one hundred five thousand two hundred eighty-five dollars through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and ~~one hundred three thousand two hundred twenty-one~~ one hundred eight thousand four hundred forty-four dollars thereafter.

SECTION 6. GOVERNOR'S SALARY - EXEMPTION. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the governor accept the governor's salary under section 54-07-04 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. If the governor chooses to not accept the salary or any portion of the salary for the governor pursuant to section 54-07-04, section 54-07-04 does not apply and the related funding included in the governor's salary line item in section 1 of this Act may not be spent and must be canceled pursuant to section 54-44.1-11 at the end of the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021."

This amendment also:

- Adjusts Section 2 to specify the Governor's office report to the Budget Section when any additional income from federal or other sources is received by the office.
- Adds a section to provide the statutory changes needed to increase the Governor's salary by 2 percent on July 1, 2019, and 3 percent on July 1, 2020.
- Adds a section to provide the statutory changes needed to increase the Lieutenant Governor's salary by 2 percent on July 1, 2019, and 3 percent on July 1, 2020.
- Adds a section to allow the Governor to decline the salary for the office during the 2019-21 biennium. The section requires the Governor's office to turn back any 2019-21 biennium salaries and wages funding not used for the Governor's position at the end of the biennium.

SB 2039: Appropriations Committee (Sen. Holmberg, Chairman) recommends **AMENDMENTS AS FOLLOWS** and when so amended, recommends **DO PASS** (14 YEAS, 0 NAYS, 0 ABSENT AND NOT VOTING). SB 2039 was placed on the Sixth order on the calendar.

Page 1, line 1, replace "two new sections to chapter 6-09" with "a new section to chapter 15-10"

Page 1, remove lines 5 through 23

Page 2, replace lines 1 through 28 with:

"SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Skilled workforce scholarship program - Skilled workforce scholarship fund - State board of higher education - Continuing appropriation.

1. There is created in the state treasury the skilled workforce scholarship fund. The fund consists of moneys transferred into the fund by the legislative assembly, matching funds received, and scholarship repayments. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the state board of higher education on a continuing basis for the purpose of providing grants to institutions of higher education related to skilled workforce scholarships. Institutions of higher education include institutions under the control of the state board of higher education, North Dakota nonpublic accredited institutions of higher education, and tribally controlled community colleges.
2. The state board of higher education shall develop policies to administer a skilled workforce scholarship program in cooperation with the Bank of North Dakota and the workforce education advisory council. The purpose of the skilled workforce scholarship program is to attract and retain students for professional or technical skills in high demand in this state.
3. The state board of higher education and the workforce education advisory council shall compile a list of qualifying educational programs by August first of each year. Qualifying educational programs must be able to be completed within four semesters or eight quarters and pertain to the technical skills in high demand in this state.
4. Individuals enrolled in a qualifying educational program in this state may apply for a scholarship under this section. Scholarships are limited to the amount charged each quarter or semester by the educational institution for the tuition, fees, books, and supplies required for the qualifying educational program. The scholarships may supplement any other scholarship or grant financial aid received by a student to assist the student with the costs of the qualifying educational program.
5. To be eligible for a scholarship under this section, a student shall maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average, based on a 4.0 grading system. A student may not receive scholarships under this section for more than the equivalent of four semesters of full-time enrollment or eight quarters of full-time enrollment. Upon completion of a qualifying educational program, a student who received a scholarship under this section shall remain and work in this state for a minimum of three years.
6. An individual shall repay the scholarship pursuant to the terms in the individual's scholarship award agreement if the individual fails to maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average while enrolled, discontinues attendance before the completion of any semester or quarter for which a scholarship has been received, or fails to remain and work in this state for at least three years following degree or certificate completion.
7. Each quarter or semester, the state board of higher education shall distribute grants to institutions of higher education to provide the amounts necessary for the scholarships awarded to the students enrolled in each institution. The state board of higher education may distribute grants only to the extent that the private sector has provided one dollar of matching funds for each dollar of funding provided by the state."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

This amendment consolidates the skilled workforce scholarship program and fund in one section of North Dakota Century Code, provides for the State Board of Higher Education to

administer the program rather than the Bank of North Dakota, and provides other minor technical corrections.

REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE

 - c. One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may include civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, North Dakota studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;

5. a. Completed one unit of physical education; or
 - b. One-half unit of physical education and one-half unit of health;
6. Completed:
 - a. One unit selected from:
 - (1) Foreign languages;
 - (2) Native American languages;
 - (3) American sign language;
 - (4) Fine arts; or
 - (5) Career and technical education courses; and
 - b. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 20.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Airboat regulation - Penalty.

1. For purposes of this section, unless context otherwise requires:
 - a. "Airboat" means a vessel designed primarily for use in shallow waters and powered by an internal combustion engine with an airplane-type propeller mounted above the stern and used to push air across a set of rudders.
 - b. "Muffler" means an automotive-style sound-suppression device or system designed to abate effectively the sound of exhaust gases emitted from an internal combustion engine and prevent excessive sound when installed on an engine.
2. The exhaust of an internal combustion engine used on an airboat operated on the waters of this state must be equipped with an automotive-style factory muffler, underwater exhaust, or other manufactured device capable of adequately muffling the sound of the exhaust of the engine. The use of cutouts or flex pipe as the sole source of muffling is prohibited. This subsection does not apply to authorized law enforcement airboats or other emergency response airboats.
3. An airboat operator who violates subsection 2 is guilty of a class 1 noncriminal offense.
4. An airboat operator cited for a violation of subsection 2 may not operate the airboat that is not in compliance with subsection 2 until a muffler is installed."
