FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

HCR 3004: A concurrent resolution requesting the Legislative Management to study the potential benefit value of blockchain technology implementation and utilization in state government administration and affairs.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

HCR 3009: A concurrent resolution recognizing the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution, which provided women the right to vote, and urging Congress to continue working to provide equal rights to women.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

- **HCR 3011:** A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying those provisions of the North Dakota Century Code which relate to the provision of elementary and secondary education.
- Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

HCR 3018: A concurrent resolution urging the Congress of the United States to provide veterans with medical coverage for hyperbaric oxygenation therapy.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3019: A concurrent resolution expressing gratitude for the outstanding services provided to North Dakota veterans by the Veterans Honor Flight of North Dakota and Minnesota and the North Dakota Native Veterans Honor Flight.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3023: A concurrent resolution honoring the service and devotion our fallen armed forces veterans have made to this great nation.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3025: A concurrent resolution urging Congress and the President to fund construction of a wall and border control impediments along with the strengthening of border control infrastructure, and urging Congress and the President to ensure compliance with and enforcement of federal immigration laws.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

HCR 3027: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying the expansion of the Public Employees Retirement System's uniform group insurance health benefits for long-term state employees who separate from employment due to reduction in force or retirement.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3029: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to pass a federal prohibition on abortions performed 20 weeks postfertilization.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

HCR 3033: A concurrent resolution requiring the flag of the United States of America to be flown in Memorial Hall at all times in honor of veterans and members of the armed forces.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3035: A concurrent resolution congratulating Cara Mund for being crowned Miss America 2018.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3041: A concurrent resolution urging Congress to pass Savanna's Act. Was read the first time and referred to the **Human Services Committee**.

HCR 3044: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying, in consultation with the Department of Commerce, Department of Human Services, and the private sector, the desirability and feasibility of developing and expanding asset-building opportunities, including a review of state and federal policies associated with government assistance which impede or improve low-income workers' ability to earn more income.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.
