Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 11, 2019

The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Sanford presiding.

The prayer was offered by Pastor Paul Herr, Century Baptist Church, Bismarck.

The roll was called and all members were present except Senators Bekkedahl and Osland.

A quorum was declared by the President.

CORRECTION AND REVISION OF THE JOURNAL

REMARKS OF SENATOR WANZEK

MR. PRESIDENT: The Jamestown Blue Jay boys basketball team made history last Saturday night at Bismarck Civic Center. Jamestown completed a perfect Class A season, becoming the first ever West Region team to go undefeated in achieving a state championship in boys basketball. Only three other teams, all Eastern Dakota Conference members, have gone undefeated to a State Class A title in ND high school basketball history, Fargo North (2002), Fargo South (1989) and Wahpeton (1941). Now we can add Jamestown to that exclusive list. This is Jamestown's 1st title in 26 years since 1993, my first legislative session.

Jamestown started hot and led by as many as 20 points in the first half and finished the game, victorious at 66-49. For those who followed the Blue Jays this season, know this group of young men were a team in the truest sense of the word. While there were individual accomplishments, mainly from tournament MVP Mason Walters, all tournament member Bowden Skunberg, or their senior leader Jared Kallenbach, each and everyone of the student-athlete teammates were committed first to their collective success. These players not only accepted their roles, they embraced them. They worked together to achieve a shared goal. This is a lesson for our young people, but also an inspirational reminder for all of us.

And lastly, one cannot end this commendation without highlighting the Blue Jays' young, dynamic 2nd year class A coach of the year in ND, Jacoby Lloyd. What a fantastic job of teaching and coaching he provided in motivating these young men to reach their lofty goal of an undefeated state team championship season!

Congratulations to Coach Lloyd, his coaching assistants and the 19 young men of the Jamestown Blue Jays. This is a legacy that will remain within their memory throughout their lives. The community of Jamestown could not be prouder of their Blue Jays.

Mr. President, Title town has taken flight and soared high with the wind under its wings and has landed in Jamestown.

They actually began on this road to perfection from the 3rd grade. They worked tirelessly to improve to the point that they achieved this success after having come off a 2-19 season just two years ago, and a mediocre year last year.

The work these young men put in to do this included many hours of practice, one heck of a lot of fortitude, awesome coaching, and the best fan support around. I want to congratulate these young men, their great coaching staff, and fans.

Mr. President, we should all join in applauding the coach of this team who was selected Coach of the Year, and two of his players being unanimous selections to the all tournament team. One, Mason Walters, being the MVP, who is going to the University at Jamestown next year. This capped off the perfect season and they did this with pure class, a stunning offense, and a stifling defense.

Others may talk of luck or of all things magic to reach this level of perfection, but not this time. These Jamestown Blue Jays did it the old-fashioned way. They earned it, and the Buffalo City could not be prouder of their accomplishment.
