1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

- 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision
- 3 services school for the blind; to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction; to provide for a
- 5 report to the legislative assembly; to provide for a legislative management study; to provide
- 6 exemptions; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the department of public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, 12 and North Dakota vision services - school for the blind for the purpose of defraying the 13 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 14 2021, as follows:

1 The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget 2 for the 2021-23 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and North 3 Dakota vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees of the 4 sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium 5 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - ESTIMATED INCOME - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. 7 The sum of \$377,764,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in 8 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any 9 additional amount in the state tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public 10 schools is appropriated to the department of public instruction for that purpose for the biennium 11 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 12 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND. The 13 estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$111,200,000 from 14 the foundation aid stabilization fund in the state treasury, of which \$110,000,000 is for integrated 15 formula payments and \$1,200,000 is for a rewrite of the state automated reporting system, for 16 the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 17 SECTION 5. EXEMPTION - FUNDING TRANSFER - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding 18 section 54-16-04, the superintendent of public instruction may transfer up to \$4,000,000 from 19 the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - special education line item, for the 20 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, for the purposes of providing 21 special education grants. The superintendent of public instruction shall notify the office of 22 management and budget of any transfer made pursuant to this section. 23 SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - COMPUTER SCIENCE TRAINING FOR TEACHERS. Up to 24 \$3,000,000 of the unexpended amount remaining from the appropriation for integrated formula 25 payments, as authorized in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 12 of the 2017 Session Laws, 26 is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 at the end of the 2017-19 biennium, and 27 may be continued into the 2019-21 biennium for the purpose of providing computer science 28 training for teachers. 29 SECTION 7. EXEMPTION - ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAMS. Up to \$600,000 of

the unexpended amount remaining from the appropriation for integrated formula payments, as
authorized in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 12 of the 2017 Session Laws, is not subject

to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 at the end of the 2017-19 biennium, and may be
continued into the 2019-21 biennium for the purpose of providing advanced placement
examinations, advanced placement teacher training, and the college ready English and
mathematics programs.

5 SECTION 8. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may
expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education
contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for paying grants for educational
services that were due in the 2017-19 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly
supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2019. To be reimbursed under this
section, claims must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public
instruction by June 30, 2020.

13 SECTION 9. GRANTS - SPECIAL EDUCATION DEFICIENCY AUTHORIZATION. If funds

provided to the superintendent of public instruction in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for grants - special education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, are not sufficient to meet special education contract obligations, the superintendent of public instruction shall request supplemental funding from the sixty-seventh legislative assembly.

18 SECTION 10. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING 19 DISTRIBUTION.

The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units.

2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of
28 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for
29 students participating in the Medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the
30 amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special

REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS- DISTRIBUTION.

8 SECTION 14. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS- DISTRIBUTION.

9 The integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes

10 \$500,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing annual grants to regional education

associations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. An annual

12 grant of \$31,250 is provided to each regional education association that exists as of July 1,

13 2019. Regional education associations that merge during the 2019-21 biennium are entitled to

14 the annual grants that would have been paid to each of the member associations.

SECTION 15. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section
 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its
 operating account.

SECTION 16. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The grants line item in subdivision 2 of
section 1 of this Act includes \$1,737,528 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than onehalf may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

21 SECTION 17. EXEMPTION - SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION

INTERPRETER GRANT PROGRAM DISTRIBUTION. The grants line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. Moneys appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11.

27 Funds must be distributed pursuant to the provisions of this section:

The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for
 which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly
 reimbursement.

1	2.	To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the				
2		deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the				
3		amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf				
4		or hard of hearing.				
5	3.	The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount				
6		appropriated during the first year of the biennium.				
7	4.	If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the				
8		deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the				
9		biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level.				
10	5.	At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education,				
11		the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding				
12		the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs.

24	report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement					
25	the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative assembly.
