4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:			
5	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

1 Engage public and private stakeholders in performing the duties of the working 2 group. 3 <u>f.</u> Provide annual reports to the legislative management regarding the status of the 4 working group's activities and any recommendations. 5 <u>2.</u> The working group membership must include representatives of: 6 The department of corrections and rehabilitation: <u>a.</u> 7 The state department of health; b. 8 The state board of higher education; <u>C.</u> 9 The department of human services; <u>d.</u> 10 The Indian affairs commission; <u>e.</u> 11 <u>f.</u> The insurance department; 12 The judicial branch; <u>g.</u> 13 The committee on protection and advocacy; h. 14 The department of public instruction; and <u>i.</u> 15 Ĺ. Other public and private stakeholders identified by the behavioral health division. 16 The director of the behavioral health division, or the director's designee, shall serve as <u>3.</u> 17 the presiding officer of the working group. The working group shall meet at least 18 biannually. Additional meetings may be held at the discretion of the presiding officer. 19 The department shall maintain a network of clinicians to implement, evaluate, and <u>4.</u> 20 sustain the practice of evidence-based mental health treatment for children who have 21 experienced traumatic life events. The network shall maintain an online directory and 22 facilitate an ongoing learning community for clinicians trained in trauma-focused 23 cognitive behavioral therapy. The network shall also offer trauma-based trainings for 24 other child serving systems. 25 SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2023, and after that 26 date is ineffective.
