## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-13-10. Criteria for teacher licensure.
- The board shall establish by rule the criteria for teacher licensure and the process for
  issuing teaching licenses. The criteria must include considerations of character,
  adequate educational preparation, and general fitness to teach.
  - The board may not require a teacher who graduated from an accredited teacher education program on or before September 1, 1980, to earn any college credits in native American or other multicultural courses as a condition of licensure or license renewal.
- This section does not affect the validity of teaching certificates in effect on July 31, 2001.
- This section does not affect the qualifications for career and technical education
  certificates, as otherwise established by law.
- 19 <u>5.</u> <u>The board shall grant an initial license to an individual who:</u>
- 20 <u>a. Possesses a bachelor's degree;</u>
- b. Passes a criminal history record check required by section 15.1-13-14; and
- 22 <u>c. Successfully completes the American board for certification of teacher excellence</u>
  23 alternative teacher certification program.

6. An individual who obtains an initial license under subsection 5 is authorized to teach
 the subject and educational levels for which the individual has successfully completed
 the American board for certification of teacher excellence alternative teacher
 certification program. Upon completing two years of teaching under a license issued
 under subsection 5, the licensee is eligible to apply for a five-year renewal license.
