- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to initial teaching licenses for individuals completing alternative teacher certification
- 3 program; to provide for a legislative management report; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

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7 **15.1-13-10.** Criteria for teacher licensure.

- The board shall establish by rule the criteria for teacher licensure and the process for
 issuing teaching licenses. The criteria must include considerations of character,
 adequate educational preparation, and general fitness to teach.
- 1 2. The board may not require a teacher who graduated from an accredited teacher
- education program on or before September 1, 1980, to earn any college credits in
 native American or other multicultural courses as a condition of licensure or license
 renewal.
- 15 3. This section does not affect the validity of teaching certificates in effect on July 31,2001.
- This section does not affect the qualifications for career and technical education
 certificates, as otherwise established by law.
- 19 <u>5.</u> <u>The board shall grant an initial license to an individual who:</u>
 - a. Possesses a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution;
- 21 b. Passes a criminal history record check required by section 15.1-13-14; and
- 22 <u>c.</u> Successfully completes an alternative teacher certification program-operated by a
 23 <u>nonprofit organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue</u>
 24 <u>Code [26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3)], which:</u>

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1	<u>(1)</u> Operates in at least five states;		
2	(2) Has operated an alternative teacher certification program for at least ten		
3		years; and	
4		(3) Requires applicants to pass a subject area and pedagogy examination,	
5		known as the professional teaching knowledge examination, to receive	
6		certification.	
7	<u>6.</u>	An in-state alternative teacher certification program must operate in accordance with	
8		the procedures and program approval standards and requirements set by the board	
9		for teacher education programs for the licensure of educators.	
10	7.	An out-of-state alternative teacher certification program must:	
11		a. Operate in at least five states;	
12		b. Have operated an alternative teacher certification program for at least ten years;	
13		c. Require applicants to pass a subject area and pedagogy examination, known as	
14		the professional teaching knowledge examination, to receive certification; and	
15		d. Allow an individual who obtains an initial or renewal license to teach in the	
16		subject areas of:	
17		(1) Elementary education;	
18		(2) Elementary education with a reading endorsement;	
19		(3) English language arts;	
20		(4) United States and world history:	
21		(5) Mathematics;	
22		(6) General science;	
23		(7) Biology;	
24		(8) Chemistry; and	
25		(9) Physics.	
26	8.	An individual who obtains an initial license under subsection 5 is authorized to teach	
27		the subject and educational levels for which the individual has successfully completed	
28		the program described under subsection 5.	
29	<u>7.9.</u>	Upon completing two years of teaching under an initial license issued under	
30		subsection 5, the licensee is eligible to apply for a five-year renewal license if the

1	<u>a.</u>	Completes the program's clinical experience program and the North Dakota
2		teacher support system approved mentor program;
3	<u>b.</u>	Meets the requirements of section 15.1-13-35 within two years of initial licensure;

6		coursework within two years of initial licensure which includes Native American
7		studies, cultural diversity, strategies for creating learning environments that
8		contribute to positive human relationships, and strategies for teaching and
9		assessing diverse learners.

20	SECTION	12. ALTERNATIVE TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM - REPORT TO
21	LEGISLATIV	E MANAGEMENT. The education standards and practices board shall provide the
22	legislative ma	anagement a status report during the 2019-20 interim and the 2021-22 interim
23	regarding the	number of teacher licenses issued under an alternative teacher certification
24	program, the	effectiveness of the program, the quality of instruction provided under the
25	program, and	whether the program is accomplishing desired objectives. The report must include
26	a recommend	lation regarding continuation of the program.
27	SECTION	3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2023, and after that
28	date is ineffeo	ctive.
