- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 62.1-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the carrying of a concealed firearm on school property by qualified
- 3 individuals; and to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to an exception to the prohibition against possessing a firearm at a
- 5 public gathering.

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6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 62.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
 and enacted as follows:

<u>Armed first responder in schools - Possession of a concealed weapon - Liability.</u>

- 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to administer this section and develop criteria for approval of plans under this section.
- 2. The superintendent of public instruction may accept a proposal from a public school, upon approval by the school board or governing board, indicating the intention by the school to participate in an armed first responder program.
- 15 3. Within ninety days of informing the superintendent of public instruction of the intent to participate in the program, the school shall:
 - a. Identify the individual selected by the school to participate in the program and attend training to become the school's armed first responder;
 - <u>Submit a plan to the superintendent of public instruction specifying how the</u>
 <u>school will implement the program; and</u>
 - c. Participate with the superintendent of public instruction in a comprehensive
 emergency operations assessment for the purpose of identifying school crisis
 and emergency threats and risks.

1 The plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must show 2 response time from law enforcement. 3 The plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must be 4 approved by local law enforcement and the department of homeland security. 5 The plan submitted by the school to the superintendent of public instruction must 6 require the selected individual to complete training equivalent to the South Dakota 7 school sentinel program as established on August 1, 2019, or complete the course 8 established by the private investigative and security board. 9 An individual selected to become an armed first responder for a school participating in 4.7. 10 the program: 11 Must be a retired law enforcement officer or meet the requirements of a. 12 subsection 36; 13 Must be a citizen of the United States; b. 14 Must be at least twenty-one years old; <u>C.</u> 15 <u>d.</u> Shall complete a criminal background check successfully and be approved by the 16 local law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction over the school premises where 17 the individual will be an armed first responder; 18 <u>e.</u> Must be a high school graduate or meet equivalency standards; 19 <u>f.</u> Shall complete successfully a physical performed by a physician or an advanced 20 practice registered nurse and a mental evaluation by a qualified mental health 21 provider who certifies the individual is capable of performing the duties of an 22 armed first responder; 23 Shall complete successfully a faculty and administrator safety training and g. 24 emergency response program in addition to the requirements under 25 subsection 36; 26 Must be approved by the school board or governing board to carry a firearm <u>h.</u> 27 concealed on school property; and 28 Shall possess a valid class 1 firearm license from this state. 29 May not be directly responsible for the supervision of children at the time of an 30 incident requiring an action by an armed first responder.

1	<u>5.8.</u>	An individual selected to become an armed first responder at a school participating in
2		the program shall cooperate in training with local law enforcement for school
3		emergencies to provide a coordinated response to building lockdown and active killer
4		events. The individual shall attend annual training and recertification courses
5		consisting of a minimum of ten hours of instruction and a skills evaluation assessment.
6	<u>6.9.</u>	The school board or governing board of any school participating in the program shall
7		inform local law enforcement, in writing, of the name of the individual authorized by the
8		school to participate in the program.
9	7. 10.	The school board or governing board of any school participating in the program shall
10		ensure the district participates in annual active shooter training.
11	11	An individual selected as an armed first responder may not carry a firearm concealed
12		or a dangerous weapon on school premises unless:
13		a. The individual has been approved by the school board or governing body under
14		subsection 47;
15		b. The individual has completed the armed first responder curriculum requirements
16		under subsections 36 and 47; and
17		c. The individual completes the armed first responder recertification course
18		requirements every twelve months.
19	8. 12.	A firearm or dangerous weapon carried by an armed first responder on school
20		premises must remain concealed and under the direct control of the certified armed
21		first responder or stored in a lockbox accessible only by the armed first responder.
22	9. 13.	The school board or governing board shall approve a posttraumatic stress disorder
23		treatment program for armed first responders.
24	10. 14.	The school board or governing board may withdraw a school from participation in the
25		program at anytime.
26	11. 15.	A school participating in the program shall provide program evaluation data to the
27		superintendent of public instruction at the time and in the manner requested by the
28		superintendent of public instruction.
29	16.	The board of a school district or the governing body of a nonpublic school may
30		establish a program for providing a plan to establish a school first responder which

A local 14 law enforcement agency shall issue a certificate of compliance under this section 15 to an individual who is proficient; and 16 An individual's storage of a firearm or dangerous weapon in a building that is n. 17 owned or managed by the state or a political subdivision, provided: 18 (1) The individual resides in the building; 19 (2) The storage is inside the individual's assigned residential unit; and 20 The storage has been consented to by the state, the governing board, or a (3) 21 designee; and 22 An individual authorized to carry a concealed weapon on school property under <u>O.</u> 23 section 1 of this Act.
