- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a school safety and crisis hotline program; and to
- 3 provide for a continuing appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- School safety and crisis hotline program Confidentiality of records Continuing
 appropriation.
 - 1. The attorney general shall establish and administer a statewide program for receiving reports and other information related to school and student safety, including potential self-harm and potential harm or criminal acts directed at students, school employees, or schools. The program must:
 - a. Establish a method to ensure the identity of an individual providing information remains unknown to all persons, including law enforcement officers and employees of the program;
 - <u>b.</u> Establish a method whereby information obtained from an individual who
 voluntarily discloses that individual's own identity and which verifies the individual
 is wiling to be identified may be shared with law enforcement officers, employees
 operating the program, and school officials;
 - Establish a method to ensure, if the identity of an individual who is providing information becomes known, whether through voluntary disclosure or other means, the identity is not further disclosed;
 - d. Assist law enforcement agencies and other public safety organizations in the detection of dangerous, violent, or criminal activities and in the apprehension of

1			offenders or at-risk persons by promptly forwarding information received to the
2			appropriate law enforcement agency, public safety agency, and school officials;
3		<u>e.</u>	Encourage state and local media providers to promote the program by informing
4			the public of its functions and benefits;
5		<u>f.</u>	Include a crisis hotline that must be available to receive reports and information
6			twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week;
7		<u>g.</u>	Establish a means for an individual to anonymously report:
8			(1) Incidents of bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, or hazing; and
9			(2) Incidents of physical or sexual abuse committed by a school employee or
10			school volunteer;
11		<u>h.</u>	Include crisis intervention, including suicide prevention, to individuals
12			experiencing emotional distress or psychiatric distress;
13		<u>i.</u>	Provide program awareness and education materials to all preschool,
14			elementary, and secondary schools in the state at no charge to the schools; and
15		<u>j.</u>	Provide students and staff at a school that has experienced a crisis, emergency,
16			or suicide access to counseling and other resources to assist in recovering from
17			the crisis, emergency, or suicide.
18	<u>2.</u>	<u>All r</u>	ecords or information related to the operation of this program required under
19		<u>sub</u>	section 1 are exempt records as defined in section 44-04-18.1.
20	<u>3.</u>	The	attorney general may seek and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any
21		sou	rce for the purpose of carrying out its duties under this section. All moneys
22		rece	eived as gifts, grants, and donations are appropriated to the attorney general on a
23		<u>con</u>	tinuing basis for the purpose of carrying out this section.
24	<u>4.</u>	The	attorney general shall adopt rules necessary to administer the duties required to
25		carr	y out this section.
