- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a school safety and crisis hotline

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:

- 10 The attorney general shall establish and administer a statewide program for receiving 1. 11 reports and other information related to school and student safety, including potential 12 self-harm and potential harm or criminal acts directed at students, school employees, 13 or schools. The program must: 14 а. Establish a method to ensure the identity of an individual providing information 15 remains unknown to all persons, including law enforcement officers and 16 employees of the program; 17 Establish a method whereby information obtained from an individual who b. 18 voluntarily discloses that individual's own identity and which verifies the individual-19 is wiling to be identified may be shared with law enforcement officers, employees-20 operating the program, and school officials; 21 Establish a method to ensure, if the identity of an individual who is providing С.
- <u>c.</u> <u>Establish a method to ensure, in the identity of an individual who is providing</u>
 <u>information becomes known, whether through voluntary disclosure or other</u>
 <u>means, the identity is not further disclosed;</u>

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	d. Assist law enforcement agencies and other public safety organizations in the
	detection of dangerous, violent, or criminal activities and in the apprehension of
	offenders or at-risk persons by promptly forwarding information received to the
	appropriate law enforcement agency, public safety agency, and school officials;
	e. Encourage state and local media providers to promote the program by informing
	the public of its functions and benefits;
	f. Include a crisis hotline that must be available to receive reports and information
	twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week;
	g. Establish a means for an individual to anonymously report:
	(1) Incidents of bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, or hazing; and
	(2) Incidents of physical or sexual abuse committed by a school employee or
	school volunteer;
	h. Include crisis intervention, including suicide prevention, to individuals
	experiencing emotional distress or psychiatric distress;
	i. Provide program awareness and education materials to all preschool,
	elementary, and secondary schools in the state at no charge to the schools; and
	j. Provide students and staff at a school that has experienced a crisis, emergency,
	or suicide access to counseling and other resources to assist in recovering from
	the crisis, emergency, or suicide.
1.	The attorney general shall encourage and promote the use of statewide and
	locally-selected school safety and crisis reporting programs.
2.	If funding becomes available, the attorney general may:
	a. Expand a statewide program to include tailored reporting mechanisms targeted to
	incidents of bullying and physical or sexual abuse; and
	b. Conduct outreach to promote awareness of statewide or locally-selected school
	safety and crisis reporting programs.
<u>2.3.</u>	All records or information related to the operation of this program required under the
	programs described in subsection 1 are exempt records as defined in section
	<u>44-04-18.1.</u>
<u>3.4.</u>	The attorney general may seek and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any
	source for the purpose of carrying out its duties under this section. All moneys

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- 1 received as gifts, grants, and donations are appropriated to the attorney general on a
- 2 <u>continuing basis for the purpose of carrying out this section.</u>
- 3 <u>4.5.</u> The attorney general shallmay adopt rules necessary to administer the duties required
 4 to carry out this section.
