4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:				
5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12.1-21-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
6	amended and reenacted as follows:				
7	12.1-21-06. Tampering with or damaging a critical infrastructure facility or a public				
8	service <u>- Penalty</u> .				
9	1. A po	erson is guilty of an offense if he causes An individual may not cause a substantial			
10	inte	rruption or impairment of a public communication, transportation, supply of water,			
11	gas	, power, or othercritical infrastructure facility or a public service by:			
12	a.	Tampering with or damaging the tangible property of another;			
13	b.	Incapacitating an operator of sucha critical infrastructure facility or a public			
14		service; or			
15	C.	Negligently damaging the tangible property of another by fire, explosive, or other			
16		dangerous means. Damaging, destroying, vandalizing, defacing, or tampering			
17		with equipment in a critical infrastructure facility;			
18	<u>d.</u>	Damaging, destroying, vandalizing, defacing, impeding, inhibiting, or tampering			
19		with the operations of a critical infrastructure facility; or			
20	<u>e.</u>	Interfering, inhibiting, impeding, or preventing the construction or repair of a

15			ground water monitoring well, water well, or pump station;
16		<u>e.</u>	A natural gas compressor station;
17		<u>f.</u>	A liquid natural gas terminal or storage facility;
18		<u>g.</u>	Wireline telecommunications and internet infrastructure, including central offices,
19			fiber optic lines, cable lines, and all additional equipment associated with the
20			provision of broadband or telecommunication services;
21		<u>h.</u>	Wireless telecommunications infrastructure, including a cell tower, telephone pole
22			or line, including a fiber optic line;
23		<u>i.</u>	A port, railroad switching yard, railroad track, trucking terminal, or other freight
24			transportation facility;
25		<u>j.</u>	A gas processing plant, including a plant used in the processing, treatment, or
26			fractionation of natural gas or a natural gas liquid;
27		<u>k.</u>	A transmission facility used by a federally licensed radio or television station;
28		<u>l.</u>	A steel-making facility using an electric arc furnace to make steel;
29		<u>m.</u>	A facility identified and regulated by the United States department of homeland
30			security chemical facility anti-terrorism standards program;
31		<u>n.</u>	A dam regulated by the state or federal government;

1	<u>O.</u>	A natural gas transmission or distribution utility facility, including a pipeline
2		interconnection, a city gate or town border station, a metering station, below or
3		aboveground piping, a regulator station, and a natural gas storage facility;
4	<u>p.</u>	A crude oil or refined product storage and distribution facility, including a valve
5		site, pipeline interconnection, pump station, metering station, below or
6		aboveground pipeline or piping, and a truck loading or offloading facility;
7	<u>q.</u>	Any below or aboveground portion of an oil, gas, hazardous liquid, or chemical
8		pipeline, tank, railroad facility, or other storage facility;
9	<u>r.</u>	An oil and gas production site; and
10	<u>S.</u>	A site or location designated or approved for the construction of a facility
11		described in this subsection.
