# FIRST ENGROSSMENT

Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly of North Dakota

#### **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1001**

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch 2 of state government; to provide for applications, transfers, and cancellation of unexpended 3 appropriations; to provide a continuing appropriation; to create and enact two new sections to 4 chapter 15-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a presidential library operating and 5 maintenance endowment fund and a presidential documents digitization endowment fund; to 6 amend and reenact sections 54-03-20 and 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating 7 to legislative compensation; to provide for a report; to provide an effective date; and to declare 8 an emergency.

### 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance regulatory trust fund and the capitol building fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the legislative branch of state government, for the fiscal period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2021, as follows:

The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for
 the 2021-23 biennium. The legislative council shall report to the appropriations committees of
 the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

5 SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - TRANSFERS. If the actual legacy fund 6 earnings transferred to the general fund at the end of the 2019-21 biennium in accordance with 7 section 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota exceed the estimate made by the 8 sixty-sixth legislative assembly by at least \$124,370,000, there is appropriated out of any 9 moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of 10 \$60,000,000, of which the state treasurer shall immediately transfer \$50,000,000 of the sum to 11 the presidential library operating and maintenance endowment fund and shall immediately 12 transfer \$10,000,000 of the sum to the presidential documents digitization endowment fund, for 13 the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - CAPITOL BUILDING FUND. The estimated income
 line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$140,000 from the capitol building fund
 for digital signage replacement and voting system upgrades for the biennium beginning July 1,
 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

18 **SECTION 6. TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-05, the director of the office of 19 management and budget shall transfer appropriation authority between line items of the 20 legislative management and legislative council as may be requested by the chairman of the 21 legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding by the 22 chairman or the director that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the legislative 23 management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the legislative 24 management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office of 25 management and budget shall similarly make transfers of appropriation authority between the 26 line items for the sixty-sixth and sixty-seventh legislative assemblies, upon request by the 27 chairman of the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding 28 by the chairman or director that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry 29 on its functions and duties. 30 SECTION 7. APPLICATION, TRANSFER AUTHORITY, AND CANCELLATION OF

31 UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS. Sections 54-16-04 and 54-44.1-11 do not apply to

1	chapter 26 of the 2017 Session Laws. The director of the office of management and budget
2	shall make transfers of appropriation authority between the line items and the agencies of the
3	legislative branch within section 1 of that chapter as requested by the chairman of the legislative
4	management or the director of the legislative council. The office of management and budget
5	shall cancel unexpended appropriations for the legislative assembly and legislative council
6	enacted prior to the 2017-19 biennium as directed by the chairman of the legislative
7	management or the director of the legislative council.
8	SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 15-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
9	and enacted as follows:
10	Presidential library operating and maintenance endowment fund - Continuing
11	appropriation.
12	1. There is created in the state treasury the presidential library operating and
13	maintenance endowment fund. The board of university and school lands shall manage
14	the fund and shall supervise the investment of moneys in the fund.
15	2. The interest and earnings of the fund are appropriated on a continuing basis to the
16	board of university and school lands to provide annual grants for the operating and
17	maintenance costs of presidential libraries located in North Dakota.
18	SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 15-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
19	and enacted as follows:
20	Presidential documents digitization endowment fund - Continuing appropriation.
21	There is created in the state treasury the presidential documents digitization endowment
22	fund. The board of university and school lands shall manage the fund and shall supervise the
23	investment of moneys in the fund. The interest and earnings of the fund are appropriated on a
24	continuing basis to the board of university and school lands to provide annual grants to
25	educational institutions and educational institution foundations for the digitization of documents
26	related to Theodore Roosevelt.
27	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
28	amended and reenacted as follows:

### 1 54-03-20. Compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the legislative

2 assembly.

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Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive as compensation for
 services the sum of one hundred seventy-seveneighty-one dollars for each calendar
 day during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for each day
 that member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the organizational
 session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule.

- 8 2. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for a. 9 lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under 10 this subdivision by the director of the office of management and budget for 11 lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04 12 for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular 13 session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of 14 management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the 15 subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times seventy percent of 16 the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that date as provided under
- 17 subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04.
- 18 b. Notwithstanding subdivision a:
  - (1) A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required by section 44-08-04.
- 23 (2) The legislative management may establish guidelines that may result in a
  24 reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more
  25 legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the
  26 amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a.
- 3. a. Members of the legislative assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are
  also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one round trip taken
  during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in
  session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative
  assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation

1			that reimbursement for travel by common carrier may be only at the cost of coach
2			fare and may not exceed one and one-half times the amount the member would
3			be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel by motor vehicle.
4		b.	A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement for
5			lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member
6			represents is not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the
7			rate provided for state employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one
8			round trip taken per day between the residence and the place of meeting of the
9			legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for
10			lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section
11			44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not
12			claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum
13			monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2.
14	4.	The	amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the
15		orga	nizational session in December and each month upon submission of a voucher
16		and	appropriate documentation during a regular or special session, consistent with

29			the biennium, the sum of fourfive hundred ninety-five five dollars a month, paid

11		committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend.
12	6.	A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,
13		special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a
14		calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee
15		meeting for the purposes of this section.
16	7.	a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the
17		member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during
18		the biennium, the sum of five hundred five <u>fifteeneighteen</u> dollars a month, paid
19		monthly.

21		may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for
22		which the member was actually a member.
23		c. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of
24		the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader,
25		are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other
26		compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of three
27		hundred sixty-twosixty-nineseventy-one dollars per month during the biennium for
28		their execution of public duties.
29	8.	Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative
30		assembly by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this
31		section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross

9.	Before each regular legislative session, the legislative management shall make
	recommendations and submit any necessary legislation to adjust legislative
	compensation amounts.

54-3	5-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
	the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
	attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
	of one hundred seventy-seveneighty-one dollars per day and must also be paid for
	expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
	duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
	legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
	spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
	and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
	receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
	management or of the committee which the person chairs.
SEC	TION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amende	d and reenacted as follows:
54-3	5-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
	the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
	attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
	of one hundred eighty-oneeighty-fiveeighty-six dollars per day and must also be paid
	for expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their
	official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.

2		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
3		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
4		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
5		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
6		management or of the committee which the person chairs.
7	SEC	CTION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 7 and 910 and 12 of this Act become effective
8	on July	1, 2019, and sections <del>8 and 10<u>11</u> and 13</del> of this Act become effective on July 1, 2020.
9	SEC	CTION 15. EFFECTIVE DATE. Subsection 2 of the new section to chapter 15-03 of the
10	North Dakota Century Code, as created in section 8 of this Act, becomes effective when a	
11	presidential library foundation certifies to the commissioner of university and school lands that:	
12	1.	The presidential library foundation has received the sum of \$100,000,000 in cash
13		donations and binding pledged donations for the construction of a presidential library
14		and for grants to affected entities; and
15	2.	The foundation has donated \$300,000 to a city in North Dakota for prior costs incurred
16		related to planning for a presidential library.
17	SECTION 16. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
