1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 corrections and rehabilitation: to authorize the conveyance of real property owned by the state

3 of North Dakota; to provide for a legislative management study; and to provide a report.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying 9 the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning 10 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, as follows:

3	The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget			
4	for the 2021-23 biennium. The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall report to the			
5	appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time			
6	funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.			
7	SECTION 3. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS			
8	FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$1,468,000 from the			
9	strategic investment and improvements fund for campus infrastructure studies, extraordinary			
10	repairs, an inmate tracking system, information technology upgrades, security equipment, and			
11	other one-time funding items.			
12	SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROGRAM. The			
13	\$7,000,000 from the general fund appropriated in the adult services line item relating to the			
14	community behavioral health program in section 1 of chapter 40 of the 2017 Session Laws is			
15	not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this appropriation may be			
16	used for the community behavioral health program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,			
17	and ending June 30, 2021.			
18	SECTION 5. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION OPERATING			
19	FUND REVENUES. Any moneys received by the department of corrections and rehabilitation			
20	from correctional supervision, electronic monitoring, and detention; reimbursements from other			
21	agencies; profits received from department of corrections and rehabilitation commissary;			
22	miscellaneous revenue, including offender fines, fees, restitution, and medical copayments; ar			
23	from the common schools trust fund, may be deposited in the department of corrections and			
24	rehabilitation operating fund and expended pursuant to legislative appropriation for the			
25	biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.			
26	SECTION 6. CONVEYANCE OF LAND AND BUILDINGS - TOMPKINS BUILDING -			
27	EXEMPTION. The state of North Dakota, by and through the department of human services,			
28	shall convey ownership of building 2404, formerly known as the nursing residence building and			
29	Tompkins building, and surrounding real property on the grounds of the state hospital, to the			
30	department of corrections and rehabilitation. The provisions of chapters 48-01.1 and 54-44.7			

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1	relating to public improvement contract bids and architect, engineer, and land surveying				
2	services for construction and renovation do not apply to this conveyance.				
3	SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS				
4	AND REHABILITATION. During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall study				
5	the department of corrections and rehabilitation. The study must address the feasibility and				
6	desirability of relocating female inmates from the Dakota women's correctional and rehabilitation				
7	center in New England to another location and the feasibility and desirability of relocating				
8	minimum security male inmates from the Missouri River correctional center in Bismarck to				
9	New England or another location. The study must include a review of:				
10	1.	Service needs of female inmates;			
11	2.	Service needs of male inmates;			
12	3.	Services available to female inmates at the Dakota women's correctional and			
13		rehabilitation center;			
14	4.	Services available to male inmates at the Missouri River correctional center;			
15	5.	Facility needs, including changes needed to continue to serve male inmates and			
16		changes needed to serve female inmates, and associated costs;			
17	6.	The short-term and long-term costs and benefits of relocating female inmates to			
18		another location;			
19	7.	The short-term and long-term costs and benefits of relocating minimum security male			
20		inmates to New England or another location;			
21	8.	Available services and work release opportunities for minimum security male inmates			
22		in New England and other locations; and			
23	9.	The feasibility and desirability of increasing regional detention and transition facilities			
24		for female inmates across the state.			
25	The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with				
26	any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative				
27	assembly.
