A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
 commerce; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century

3 <u>Code, relating to a beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program; to provide</u>

4 exemptions; to provide for a legislative management study of the unmanned aircraft systems

5 **industry**; to provide for a transfer; to provide for a report; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021,
as follows:

SECTION 3. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated for the agricultural products utilization
 commission in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws is not subject to section
 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item for grants are available for grants during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.
 SECTION 3. DISCRETIONARY FUNDS - RURAL HEALTH. Of the \$2,150,000 from the
 general fund appropriated in the discretionary funds line item in section 1 of this Act, \$200,000
 is designated for providing matching funds to an organization assisting in the recruitment,

29 distribution, and supply, and enhancing the quality and efficiency of personnel providing health

30 services in rural areas of the state.

1	SECTION 4. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$2,200,000 appropriated in the discretionary
2	funds line item in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws, of which \$1,200,000 was
3	from the general fund and \$1,000,000 was from the research North Dakota fund, is not subject
4	to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for
5	discretionary uses during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.
6	SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$2,000,000 appropriated from the strategic
7	investment and improvements fund for the unmanned aircraft systems program in section 1 of
8	chapter 43 of the 2017 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended
9	funds from this program are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1,
10	2019, and ending June 30, 2021.
11	SECTION 6. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$1,500,000 appropriated from the general fund
12	for the early childhood education grant program in section 1 of chapter 43 of the 2017 Session
13	Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this program are
14	available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30,
15	2021.
16	SECTION 7. TRANSFER - INTERNSHIP FUND. The office of management and budget
17	shall transfer \$855,000 of the amount appropriated in the operating expenses line item in
18	section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation intern
19	program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.
20	SECTION 8. EXEMPTION. The amount of \$950,000 appropriated from the general fund in
21	the operating expenses line item for the operation intern program in section 1 of chapter 43 of
22	the 2017 Session Laws and transferred to the internship fund in section 7 of chapter 43 of the
23	2017 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this
24	program are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending
25	June 30, 2021.
26	SECTION 9. TRADE OFFICE - MATCHING FUND REQUIREMENT. The North Dakota
27	trade office line item and the general fund appropriation in section 1 of this Act include
28	\$1,600,000 of funding relating to the North Dakota trade office. The department of commerce
29	may spend sixty percent of this amount without requiring any matching funds from the trade
30	office. Any additional amounts may be spent only to the extent the North Dakota trade office
31	provides one dollar of matching funds from private or other public sources for each one dollar

1 provided by the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 2 Matching funds may include money spent by businesses or organizations to pay salaries to 3 export assistants, provide training to export assistants, or buy computer equipment as part of 4 the North Dakota trade office's export assistance program. 5 SECTION 10. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM - ONE-TIME 6 FUNDING - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - EXEMPTION. 7 Section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$948,467\$2,948,467, of which \$740,956 is from the 8 general fund, \$2,000,000 is from the strategic investment and improvements fund, and 9 \$207,511 is from special funds the economic development fund, for an entrepreneurship grants 10 and voucher program to be developed and administered by the department of commerce, for 11 the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The \$2,000,000 from the 12 strategic investment and improvements fund is considered a one-time funding item. Of the 13 \$2,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund, \$900,000 is to be distributed 14 equally to entrepreneurial centers located in Bismarck, Fargo, and Grand Forks, and \$150,000 15 is to be distributed to the entrepreneurial center located in Jamestown. The funding for the 16 Jamestown entrepreneurial center may only be provided to the extent the center provides one 17 dollar of matching funds from private or other nonstate sources for each one dollar provided by 18 the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The 19 department shall establish guidelines to provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified by 20 the department. The department also shall establish guidelines to award vouchers to 21 entrepreneurs to procure business development assistance from certified entrepreneurial 22 centers or to provide grants to entrepreneurs working with an entrepreneurial center. The 23 amount appropriated for entrepreneurship grants in section 1 of this Act is not subject to section 24 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium 25 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. 26 SECTION 11. BIOTECHNOLOGY GRANT PROGRAM. Section The grants line item in 27 section 1 of this Act includes \$300,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing 28 biotechnology grants to a local association with bioscience experience to promote bioscience 29 and biotechnology research and business development in North Dakota agriculture and life and

30 energy science industries.

1	SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - 2017-19 BIENNIUM - BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF
2	SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS SYSTEM PROGRAM - EXEMPTION. There is
3	appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
4	appropriated, the sum of \$27,000,000 \$28,000,000, or so much as the sum as may be
5	necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses relating to
6	the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems system program, for the period
7	beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2019. The funding provided
8	under this section is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds may be
9	continued and are available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and
10	ending June 30, 2021.
11	
12	PROGRAM - REQUIREMENTS - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT. Section 9 of this
13	Act includes a \$27,000,000 general fund appropriation to the department of commerce for-
14	operating expenses of the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems program. The
15	department of commerce shall require any entity receiving funding from this appropriation to-
16	provide the department a copy of the entity's annual audited financial statements associated
17	with the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems. Any entity receiving funding-
18	from this appropriation shall provide quarterly payments to the state treasurer equal to
19	15 percent of the entity's annual net income associated with beyond visual line of sight-
20	unmanned aircraft systems as reported in its prior year audited financial statements, until the
21	state treasurer has received a total of \$27,000,000. Thereafter, the entity shall provide quarterly
22	payments to the state treasurer equal to 10 percent of the entity's annual net income associated
23	with beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems as reported in its prior year audited
24	financial statements. The state treasurer shall deposit any funds received under this section in
25	the state general fund. The department of commerce shall provide periodic reports to the
26	legislative management during the 2019-20 interim regarding the development of the beyond
27	visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems program and the total amount deposited by the
28	state treasurer in the state general fund related to this section.
29	SECTION 13. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
30	and enacted as follows:

1	Beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program - Requirements -
2	Report to legislative management.
3	The department may establish and administer a beyond visual line of sight unmanned
4	aircraft system program for the design, purchase, implementation, and operating costs of a
5	beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system. The department shall require any entity
6	receiving funding for this program which is operating the beyond visual line of sight unmanned
7	aircraft system to provide quarterly payments to the state treasurer equal to three percent of the
8	entity's gross income associated with the operation of the beyond visual line of sight unmanned
9	aircraft system as reported in the entity's prior year financial statements. The state treasurer
10	shall deposit any funds received under this section in the state general fund. The department
11	shall provide semi-annual reports to the legislative management regarding the development of
12	the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft system program and the total amount
13	deposited by the state treasurer in the state general fund.
14	SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - BEYOND VISUAL LINE OF
15	SIGHT UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS SYSTEM PROGRAM. During the 2019-20 interim,
16	the legislative management shall consider studying the future administration and regulation of
17	the unmanned aircraft systems industry in North Dakota, including beyond visual line of sight
18	unmanned aircraft systemssystem. The study must include a determination of the appropriate
19	state agency or private entity to be assigned responsibility of regulating unmanned aircraft
20	systemssystem programs, including licensing, registration, appropriate fees, and other
21	responsibilities. The study may include a review of the audited financial statements associated
22	with the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft systems system of an entity receiving
23	funding from the appropriation for the beyond visual line of sight unmanned aircraft
24	systemssystem program in section 9 of this Act. The legislative management shall report its
25	findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement the
26	recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative assembly.
27	SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MOTION PICTURE INCENTIVES.
28	During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying motion picture
29	incentives. The study must include a review of upper Midwest and neighboring states' statutes
30	on motion picture incentives to assess their successes and challenges; an analysis of the
31	economic impact that would benefit communities through food, lodging, supplies, and

transportation; an assessment of existing industry infrastructure in the state and opportunities
for growth; and an identification of unique geographic, seasonal, regulatory, and topographical
assets the state has for the motion picture industry. The legislative management shall report its
findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement the
recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative assembly.

6 SECTION 16. SCULPTURE MAINTENANCE GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING. The grants 7 line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$75,000 from the general fund for the purpose of 8 providing grants, on a reimbursement basis, to maintain the structure and appearance of metal 9 sculptures located adjacent to highways in North Dakota. Grant funds may be awarded only for 10 sculptures with current land leases. The department of commerce shall establish guidelines to 11 require a privately funded maintenance plan to be established for future maintenance cost of 12 metal sculptures adjacent to highways in North Dakota. This funding is considered a one-time 13 funding item.

SECTION 17. NONRESIDENT NURSE EMPLOYMENT RECRUITMENT PROGRAM -

ONE-TIME FUNDING. The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$800,000 from the
general fund for the purpose of establishing a nonresident nurse employment recruitment
program. The department of commerce shall provide up to \$4,000 in incentives for each
nonresident licensed nurse who signs a written agreement to work at least four years in a North
Dakota licensed health care facility. Any licensed health care facility receiving funds from this
program must provide two dollars of incentive matching funds for each one dollar provided by
the department. This funding is considered a one-time funding item.

22 SECTION 18. TRANSFER - ESTIMATED INCOME- BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING 23 LOAN FUND - ONE-TIME FUNDING. As requested by the commissioner of the department of 24 commerce, the Bank of North Dakota shall transfer from the beginning farmer revolving loan 25 fund to the department of commerce the sum of \$1,300,000, or so much of the sum as may be 26 necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act for paying 27 intermodal container transportation shipping fees in the event intermodal containers are unable 28 to be shipped, resulting in fees for the transport of containers to new locations for the biennium 29 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. This funding is considered a one-time

30 funding item.

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1 **SECTION 19. APPROPRIATION - 2017-19 BIENNIUM - NORTH DAKOTA GORGE** 2 **PRESERVATION GRANTS - EXEMPTION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 3 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$750,000, or so much 4 of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of providing 5 grants, on a reimbursement basis, to an organization dedicated to preserving a North Dakota 6 gorge for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2019. 7 Grant funds may be awarded only for expenditures related to the purchase and maintenance of 8 outdoor recreation equipment, the improvement and maintenance of real property, enhancing 9 public access to natural resources, and addressing public safety hazards in a North Dakota 10 gorge. Grant funds may be awarded only to the extent that matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar 11 basis are provided from private or other nonstate sources. Matching funds may include in-kind 12 payments for labor and materials. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time 13 funding item. The funding provided under this section is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and 14 any unexpended funds may be continued and are available for the program during the biennium 15 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. 16 SECTION 20. JOB DEVELOPMENT AND ECONOMIC GROWTH GRANT - ONE-TIME 17 **FUNDING.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$25,000 from the general fund 18 for the purpose of providing a grant to an organization dedicated to promoting job development 19 and economic growth through the purchase of a vacant building previously used to promote job 20 development and economic growth for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending

- 21 June 30, 2021. This funding is considered a one-time funding item.
- SECTION 21. EMERGENCY. Sections 9 and 1012, 13, and 19 of this Act are declared to be
 an emergency measure.
