- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department; and to provide a report; to provide for a transfer; to provide an
- 3 exemption; and to provide for a legislative management study.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the information technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, as follows:

SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2021-23 biennium. The information technology department shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 3. EXCEPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04. the director of the office of management and budget shall make transfers of funds between line items in section 1 of this Act for the information technology department as may be requested by the chief information officer as determined necessary for the development and implementation of information technology projects. The department shall notify the legislative council of any transfers made pursuant to this section.

SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECTS. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$3,150,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for information technology projects, of which \$2,000,000 is for a legacy lift project and \$1,150,000 is for a geographic information system statewide land parcel project.

SECTION 5. EXEMPTION. The sum of \$43,555,133 of federal and other funds appropriated to the information technology department for the development of the health information network and care coordination project in chapter 46 of the 2017 Session Laws is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for the completion of the health information network and care coordination project during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

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1 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DEVELOPMENT OF A LAND 2 ACCESS DATABASE. During the 2019-20 interim, the legislative management shall consider 3 studying access to land for hunting and trapping and the development of a land access 4 database. If selected by the legislative management, the study must be conducted by a new 5 committee established by the legislative management to study access to public and private 6 lands for hunting, trapping, and related issues, including the development of a hunters access 7 database with the capability for landowners to provide electronic information regarding the 8 availability of the landowner's property for hunters and trappers. The voting members of the 9 committee must consist of the following, who must be appointed by the legislative management: 10 Two members representing agriculture organizations; 11 2. Two members representing sportsmen organizations; and 12 3. Five members of the legislative assembly, one of whom must be selected by the 13 committee as chairman of the committee, including: 14 One member of the majority party in the house of representatives: a. 15 b. One member of the minority party in the house of representatives; 16 One member of the majority party in the senate; C. 17 d. One member of the minority party in the senate; and 18 e. One member from either party in either chamber. 19 The nonvoting members of the committee are: 20 A representative of the North Dakota association of counties; 1. 21 2. The agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designee; 22 3. The director of the game and fish department or the director's designee; and 23 The chief information officer or the officer's designee. 4. 24 A member of the committee who is not a state employee is entitled to reimbursement for 25 mileage and expenses as provided by law for state officers and employees, to be paid by the 26 legislative council. A state employee who is a member of the committee is entitled to receive 27 that employee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses to be 28 paid by the employing agency. A member of the committee who is a member of the legislative 29 assembly is entitled to receive per diem compensation at the rate provided under section 30 54-35-10 for each day performing official duties of the committee. The legislative council shall

pay the per diem compensation and reimbursement for travel and expenses as provided by law

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- 1 for any member of the committee who is a member of the legislative assembly. The committee
- 2 may establish a prototype hunters access database in select counties prior to August 1, 2020.
- 3 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any
- 4 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-seventh legislative
- 5 assembly.
