- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 43-09-11 and sections 43-09-15
- 2 and 43-09-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to electrician qualifications and
- 3 license renewal; and to declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 43-09-11 of the North Dakota Century

6 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7	2.	For	licen	sure as a journeyman electrician, an applicant must have:
8		a.	Con	npleted eight thousand hours' experience in installing and repairing electrical
9			wirir	ng, apparatus, and equipment, which experience may not be obtained in less
10			thar	n three years.
11		b.	Effe	ective for an applicant who registered with the board as an apprentice after
12			Jan	uary 31, 2008, completed at least one of the following:
13			(1)	Successfully completed apprenticeship training approved by the federal-
14				bureau of apprenticeship and trainingboard and completed eight thousand
15				hours' experience in installing and repairing electrical wiring, apparatus, and
16				equipment.
17			(2)	Successfully completed an appropriate course of study, which may not be
18				less than two years or the equivalent of two years, at a board-approved
19				institution of higher education and completed eight thousand hours'
20				experience in installing and repairing electrical wiring, apparatus, and
21				equipment. The board may determine equivalent hours of education that
22				may be applied as a credit against the eight thousand hours' experience
23				requirement under this paragraph.

1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-09-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
2	amended and reenacted as follows:						
3	43-09-15. Renewal of license - Denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses.						
4	<u>1.</u>	An electrician's license may be issued for a term of only one year, but may be					
5		rene	ewed without examination upon the payment of the proper fee. If the licensee fails				
6		to renew the license for a period of three consecutive years or more, the licensee i					
7		required to appear for re-examination. The state electrical board may deny, suspen					
8		revoke, or refuse to renew any license issued or applied for under the provisions of					
9		this chapter for any of the following reasons:					
10	1.	<u>a.</u>	Failure or refusal to maintain or adhere to the minimum standards set forth in the				
11			electrical code referred to in section 43-09-21.				
12	2.	<u>b.</u>	Any cause for which the issuance of the license could have been refused had it				
13			then existed and been known to the board.				
14	3.	<u>C.</u>	Commitment of any act of gross negligence, incompetency, or misconduct in the				
15			practice of a master or journeyman electrician or the business of an electrical				
16			contractor.				
17	4.	<u>d.</u>	Material misstatement, misrepresentation, or fraud in obtaining the license.				
18	5.	<u>e.</u>	After due notice, failed or refused to correct, within the specified time, any				
19			electrical installation not in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.				
20	6.	<u>f.</u>	Failure or refusal to make deposit or acquire public liability insurance as required				
21			by sections 43-09-14 and section 43-09-20.				
22	7.	<u>g.</u>	Failure to repay or enter into a written contract for repayment, under a payment				
23			schedule acceptable to the board, of money disbursed from the fund as provided-				
24			under section 43-09-14, or failure to make timely payments under a payment				
25			contract entered into under the board's policy for administering the undertaking-				
26			fund.				
27	8.	<u>h.</u>	Failure to furnish certification of completion of continuing education as required				
28			under section 43-09-15.1.				
29	<u>2.</u>	Any person whose license is denied or whose license is suspended or revoked by the					
30		boa	rd, or who is refused a license by the board, may appeal to the appropriate court.

1 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-09-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 43-09-15.1. Continuing education Education.

4 After March 31, 1990, each Each applicant for renewal of an electrician's license pursuant to 5 section 43-09-15 must have successfully completed prior thereto at least four hours, and 6 thereafter eight hours each biennium, of continuing education relating to the standards set forth 7 in section 43-09-21 or as otherwise prescribed by the board. The board may not require more 8 than sixteen hours of continuing education in each biennium. The board shall conduct education 9 sessions for licensees each year at not less than six locations throughout the state. Attendance 10 at such sessions, or attendance at other education sessions certified by the board as approved, 11 fulfills the educational requirements of this section. The board may charge a fee to licensees for 12 attendance at the education sessions at an amount to be determined by the board, but not to 13 exceed ten dollars per person for each session. The board may expend funds to educate and 14 encourage potential electricians into the trade.

15 **SECTION 4. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
