9	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created						
10	and enacted as follows:

1 The president of the board of the North Dakota council of educational leaders or 2 the president's designee; 3 <u>f.</u> The president of the board of North Dakota united or the president's designee; 4 The president of the board of the North Dakota school boards association or the g. 5 president's designee; 6 <u>h.</u> The president of the board of the North Dakota small organized schools or the 7 president's designee; and 8 The following gubernatorial appointees: 9 An individual representing the statewide longitudinal data system <u>(1)</u> 10 committee; 11 An individual representing a tribal school; <u>(2)</u> 12 (3)An individual employed as a public school administrator; 13 (4) An individual employed as a public school principal; 14 (5) An individual employed as a public school teacher; 15 (6) A director of a special education unit; 16 A director of a regional education association; and <u>(7)</u> 17 <u>(8)</u> A behavioral health representative from the department of human services. 18 <u>3.</u> The term of office for a member appointed by the governor is four years. The governor 19 may stagger the initial appointments to the council so no more than three members' 20 terms expire in any year. 21 <u>4.</u> The council shall select a presiding officer annually from among its members. 22 5. A member of the council who is a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to 23 receive per diem compensation at the rate provided under section 54-35-10 for each 24 day performing official duties of the council and to reimbursement for travel and 25 expenses as provided by law, to be paid by the legislative council. A member of the 26 council who is not a state employee is entitled to receive as compensation sixty-two 27 dollars and fifty cents per day and to reimbursement of expenses as provided by law 28 for state officers while attending meetings of the council, to be paid by the state board 29 of public school education. A state employee who is a member of the council is entitled 30 to receive that employee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement for mileage 31 and expenses, to be paid by the employing agency.
