- 1 A BILL to provide for a task force on prevention of sexual abuse of children; and to provide for a
- 2 report to the legislative management and the governor.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON PREVENTION OF SEXUAL ABUSE OF CHILDREN -

5 **REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT AND THE GOVERNOR.**

- Beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending September 30, 2024, the task
 force on the prevention of sexual abuse of children is established to develop and
 implement a comprehensive statewide approach to the prevention of child sexual
 abuse. The statewide approach must ensure appropriate policies, funding, staffing,
 resources, and programming are available. The task force shall build upon the efforts
 of the 2017-18 North Dakota task force on the prevention of sexual abuse of children.
- 12 2. The task force consists of the following members:
- a. One member of the senate appointed by the majority leader of the senate, one
 member of the house of representatives appointed by the majority leader of the
 house of representatives, and one member of the minority party appointed by the
 minority leaders of the senate and the house of representatives;
- b. The executive director of the department of human services, or the executive
 director's designee;
- 19c. A representative of a children's advocacy center or similar organization that20assists in the investigation, prosecution, and treatment of child sexual and21physical abuse cases, appointed by the executive director of the department of22human services;

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1		d.	A representative of an organization a domestic violence rape crisis center	
2			involved in the prevention of child abuse or the treatment of child abuse victims,	
3			or both, appointed by the executive director of the department of human services;	
4		e.	The superintendent of public instruction, or the superintendent's designee;	
5		f.	A representative of law enforcement, appointed by the attorney general;	
6		g.	The executive director of the Indian affairs commission, or the executive	
7	I		director's designee;	
8		h.	One superintendentschool social worker from an urbana public school district and	
9			one from a rural school district in the state, appointed by the superintendent of	
10	I		public instruction;	
11		i.	One principal Two school principals, one from a high school, middle school, or	
12			elementaryan urban school district and one from a rural school district in the	
13			state, appointed by the superintendent of public instruction from a list provided by	
14	1		the North Dakota council of educational leaders;	
15		j.	One classroom teacher from a high school, middle school, or elementary school	
16			in the statemember from the faith-based community, appointed by the	
17			superintendent of public instruction from a list provided by North Dakota	
18			unitedattorney general;	
19		k.	OneTwo school counselorcounselors, one from a high school, middle school, or	
20			elementaryan urban school district and one from a rural school district in the	
21			state, appointed by the superintendent of public instruction from a list provided by	
22			the North Dakota school counselors association; and	
23		I.	Any other organization or individual the task force deems appropriate.	
24	3.	The executive director of the department of human services, or the executive director's		
25		designee, shall convene the task force. The task force shall elect a presiding officer by		
26		a majority vote of the membership of the task force. The task force shall meet at the		
27		call	of the presiding officer.	
28	4.	The task force shall focus on:		
29		a.	Increasing child sexual abuse prevention education for tribal and nontribal	
30			children and adults;	
31		b.	Increasing interagency data collection, sharing, and collective analysis;	

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1		C.	Supporting resource development for investigations and prosecutions of child
2			sexual abuse, including the sentencing, supervision, and treatment of sex
3			offenders;
4		d.	Increasing trauma-informed services for children, adult survivors, and families;
5			and
6		e.	Implementing the remaining recommendations of the November 2018 final report
7			of the North Dakota task force on the prevention of child sexual abuse.
8	5.	The	recommendations of the task force may include proposals for specific statutory
9		char	nges, actions the task force deems necessary and appropriate to initiate
10		awa	reness education of adults and children, and methods to foster cooperation among
11		state	e agencies and between the state and local governments in adopting and
12		impl	ementing a policy addressing sexual abuse of children which may include:
13		a.	Developmentally appropriate resources for students in prekindergarten through
14			grade twelve;
15		b.	Training for school personnel on child sexual abuse;
16		C.	Educational information to parents or guardians provided in school handbooks
17			regarding the warning signs of a child being abused, along with any needed
18			assistance, referral, or resource information;
19		d.	Available counseling and resources for students affected by sexual abuse;
20		e.	Emotional and educational support for a child of abuse to continue to be
21			successful in school; and
22		f.	Any other action deemed appropriate.
23	6.	Befo	pre July first of each even-numbered year, the task force shall submit a report,
24		toge	ther with any findings and recommendations, to the legislative management and
25		the g	governor. Before July 1, 2024, the task force shall submit a final report, together
26		with	any findings and recommendations, to the legislative management and the
27		gove	ernor.
