- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 54-12-33.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to human trafficking prevention training; and to provide a penaltycontinuing
- 3 <u>appropriation</u>.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. Section 54-12-33.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted6 as follows:

  8 <u>EnforcementContinuing appropriation.</u>
  9 <u>1. As used in this section:</u>
  10 <u>a.</u> <u>"Human trafficking" means human trafficking as defined in chapter 12.1-41.</u>
- 11b."Human trafficking commission" means the commission established under12section 54-12-33.
- 13c."Lodging establishment" means any hotel, motel, resort, building, or structure that14is used to provide sleeping accommodations to transient guests.
- 15d."Proprietor" means the person in charge of a lodging establishment and includes16an owner, lessee, and manager.
- 17 <u>2.</u> <u>Within ninety days of the effective date of this Act, the human trafficking commission</u>
- 18 shall establish an educational training program with a focus on the accurate and
- 19 prompt identification and reporting of, or response to, suspected human trafficking. To
- 20 the extent possible, the human trafficking commission shall allow the use of existing
- 21 training modules and materials. The training must include:
- 22 <u>a.</u> <u>Human trafficking awareness;</u>
- 23 b. How to recognize potential victims of human trafficking;
- 24 c. How to identify activities commonly associated with human trafficking; and
