- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to local control of education.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 School board Education local control Exemption.
- 7 <u>1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to subsection 2, a school</u> 8 <u>district may exercise sole control over:</u>
- a. The supervision, development, and instruction of kindergarten through grade
   twelve students including course content standards, required instruction,
- 11 <u>instructional time, assessments, attendance, and graduation requirements for</u>
- 12 <u>students residing in the district, and the school district is not subject to sections</u>
- 13 <u>15.1-02-04, 15.1-21-01, 15.1-21-02, 15.1-21-02.1, 15.1-21-02.2, 15.1-21-03,</u>
- 14 <u>15.1-21-08, 15.1-21-17, and 15.1-21-18, or chapters 15.1-20 and 15.1-22;</u>
- b. The negotiating, employment, termination, licensing, and credentialing of
- 16 <u>teachers and ancillary staff, and the school district is not subject to chapters</u>
- 17 <u>15.1-13, 15.1-18, and 15.1-18.1; and</u>
- 18 <u>c.</u> The establishment and adoption of student discipline and safety policies, and the school district is not subject to chapter 15.1-19.
- 20 <u>2.</u> This section applies if:
- 21 <u>a. By a majority vote of a quorum of the board, the board of the school district</u>
  22 determines local control of education is in the best interest of the students
- 23 <u>residing in the district; or</u>

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1	<u>b.</u>	<u>(1)</u>	A petition for local control is signed by at least thirty-three percent of the
2			qualified electors who reside in the district and voted at the most recent
3			school district election; and
4		<u>(2)</u>	The qualified electors of the school district voting at a special election
5			determine, by majority vote, local control of education is in the best interest
6			of the students residing in the district.
