4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

		instruction, as defined in this section.

	inst	instruction, the school is responsible for making up only those hours and portions of a			
	hou	Ir between the time of early dismissal and the conclusion of a full day of classroom			
	inst	ruction.			
4.	For	purposes of this section, a full day of instruction consists of:			
	a.	At least five and one-half hours for kindergarten and elementary students, during			
		which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of			
		receiving curricular instruction; and			
	b.	At least six hours for high school students, during which time the students are			
		required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction.
