- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to making up instructional time if school is canceled due to a no travel advisory.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-06-04. School calendar Length.
- 7 1. A school district shall provide for a school calendar that includes:
- 8 a. At least one hundred seventy-five days of instruction;
- b. Three holidays, as selected by the board in consultation with district teachers
 from the list provided for in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
 15.1-06-02;
- 12 c. No more than two days for:

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- 13 (1) Parent-teacher conferences; or
- 14 (2) Compensatory time for parent-teacher conferences held outside of regular school hours; and
- d. At least two days of professional development.
- 17 2. a. A day of professional development must consist of:
- 18 (1) Six hours of professional development, exclusive of meals and other breaks, 19 conducted within a single day;
 - (2) Six hours of cumulative professional development conducted under the auspices of a professional learning community; or
 - (3) Two four-hour periods of professional development, exclusive of meals and other breaks, conducted over two days.

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- b. If a school district offers a four-hour period of professional development, as
 permitted in this subsection, the school district may schedule instruction during
 other available hours on that same day and be credited with providing one-half
 day of instruction to students. This subdivision does not apply unless the one-half
 day of instruction equals at least one-half of the time required for a full day of
 instruction, as defined in this section.
 - 3. If because of weather a school must dismiss before completing a full day of instruction, the school is responsible for making up only those hours and portions of an hour between the time of early dismissal and the conclusion of a full day of classroom instruction, except a school is not required to make up the time between early dismissal and the conclusion of a full day of classroom instruction if the dismissal was due a no-travel advisory by the national weather service for the area encompassing the school district.
 - 4. For purposes of this section, a full day of instruction consists of:
 - At least five and one-half hours for kindergarten and elementary students, during which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction; and
 - b. At least six hours for high school students, during which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction.
