- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 61-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the Missouri River council; to provide for the acquisition and
- 3 management of the shoreline of the Missouri River; and to provide for a report to the legislative
- 4 management.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 61-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 7 and enacted as follows:

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1		<u>d.</u>	One legislator from a legislative district bordering Lake Sakakawea, which is		
2			located in the county of Burleigh, McLean, Mercer, or Oliver.		
3	<u>3.</u>	Each member of the council appointed by a county board of commissioners shall			
4		<u>ser</u>	ve for a term of two years, beginning July first, and may be reappointed for		
5		add	itional terms, not to exceed eight consecutive years as a member of the council.		
6	<u>4.</u>	The council shall meet twice per year. A majority of the membership constitutes a			
7		<u>quo</u>	<u>rum.</u>		
8	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	council shall collaborate with other organizations to make recommendations and		
9		acc	omplish objectives in the areas of irrigation, hydropower, water supply, energy		
10		<u>dev</u>	elopment, conservation and wildlife, and Lake Sakakawea. The council shall work		
11		<u>to s</u>	trengthen the state's working relationship with the United States army corps of		
12		<u>eng</u>	ineers and enhance the economic development of the state.		
13	<u>7.</u>	<u>Ann</u>	ually, before September first, the council shall report to the governor and the		
14		<u>legi</u> :	slative management on the activities of the council. The report must include any		
15		reco	ommendations from the council and any legislation required to implement the		
16		reco	ommendations.		
17	<u>8.</u>	<u>A m</u>	ember of the council who is not a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to		
18		rece	eive mileage and expenses as provided by law for state officers and employees. A		
19		mer	nber of the council who is a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to		
20		rece	eive compensation, mileage, and expenses as provided under section 54-03-20.		
21	SECTION 2. NEGOTIATING AUTHORITY - PROPERTY ACQUISITION AND				
22	MANAGEMENT. The board of university and school lands shall negotiate with the United States				
23	army corps of engineers to acquire, on behalf of North Dakota, the ownership of, and authority				
24	to manage, the shoreline of Lake Sakakawea, excluding any land owned by the Three Affiliated				
25	Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, in the counties of Burleigh, Dunn, McLean, McKenzie,				
26	Mercer, Mountrail, Oliver, and Williams. The purchase price may not exceed one dollar. An				
27	agreement reached under this section must specify the United States army corps of engineers				
28	shall retain ownership and operation of the Garrison dam and any property adjacent to the dam				
29	necessary for the operation of the dam, and the Missouri River council shall manage the				
30	acquired	l sho	reline for the state so as to maximize residents' access to Lake Sakakawea.
