- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 16.1-11-22 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the form of a primary election ballot.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-11-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 16.1-11-22. Primary election ballot Form Voters to vote for candidates of only one political party.
- 8 <u>1.</u> At the primary election there may be only one ballot for all parties or principles. The ballot must be in the following form:
- 10 <u>1. a.</u> The ballot must be entitled the "consolidated primary election ballot".
- 12 Each political party or principle having candidates at the primary election must have a separate section on the ballot.
- 13 3. c. At the head of each column must be printed the name of the political party or principle which it represents.
- 15 4. Spanning the columns containing the political party ballot and prior to the party <u>d.</u> 16 names or principle titles must be printed: "In a Political Party Primary Election, 17 you may only vote for the candidates of one political party. This ballot contains 18 the number of political parties or principles and a description of where the political 19 parties or principles are to be found in the columns below. If you vote in more 20 than one political party's section, your Political Party Ballot will be rejected; 21 however, all votes on the No Party and Measure Ballots will still be counted."
  - 5. <u>e.</u> Immediately below the warning against voting for candidates of more than one political party must be printed: "To vote for the candidate of your choice, you must darken the oval next to the name of that candidate. To vote for a person whose

1 name is not printed on the ballot, you must darken the oval next to the blank line 2 provided and write that person's name on the blank line." 3 <del>6.</del> <u>f.</u> The offices specified in section 16.1-11-26 must be arranged in each section with 4 the name of each office in the center of each political party section at the head of 5 the names of all the aspirantscandidates for the office. 6 <del>7.</del> g. Immediately under the name of each office must be printed: "Vote for no more 7 than name (or names)." 8 Immediately preceding and on the same line as the name of each <del>8.</del> <u>h.</u> 9 aspirantcandidate must be printed an oval in which the voter is to mark the 10 voter's choice by darkening the oval next to the name of the candidate chosen. 11 <del>9.</del> <u>Immediately after or under the name of a candidate who received a party</u> 12 certificate of endorsement for the office, a notation indicating the candidate was 13 endorsed by the political party or principle. 14 Immediately after or under the name of a candidate whose name is placed on the į. 15 ballot due to a nominating petition, a notation indicating the candidate was 16 nominated by petition. 17 <u>k.</u> The political party or principle which cast the largest vote for governor at the most 18 recent primary election at which the office of governor was voted upon must have 19 the first section, and the political party or principle casting the next largest vote 20 must have the second section, and so on. 21 <u>2.</u> The judges and the inspector of elections shall inform each elector at the primary, 22 before voting, that if the voter votes for candidates of more than one political party the 23 voter's political party ballot will be rejected.
