- 1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying the issues 2 and data reporting challenges related to missing and murdered indigenous people and human 3 trafficking cases. 4 WHEREAS, there are approximately 39,000 indigenous people living in the state; and 5 WHEREAS, indigenous people are victimized by human trafficking at rates higher than that 6 of the general population; and 7 WHEREAS, indigenous people are more than twice as likely to experience violent crimes 8 and at least twice as likely to experience rape and sexual assault crimes compared to other 9 races; and 10 WHEREAS, at least four out of five indigenous people have experienced violence in their 11 lifetime; and 12 WHEREAS, on some reservations, indigenous women are murdered at more than 10 times 13 the national average; and 14 WHEREAS, homicide is the third leading cause of death among indigenous women 15 between 10 and 24 years of age; and 16 WHEREAS, cases involving the disappearances of indigenous people often are difficult to
