9	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 28 of section 50-06-05.1 of the North Dakota						
10	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5	North Da	akota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:				
6		d. Additional Except as otherwise required by section 62.1-04-06, additional testing				
7		is not required to renew a class 2 firearm and dangerous weapon license. A				
8		class 1 firearm license may be renewed upon successful completion of the				
9		class 1 firearm requirements and the requirements provided in section				
10		62.1-04-06 within thirty days before submission of the application for renewal.

13		f. An applicant for a class 1 firearm license or a class 2 firearm and dangerous				
14		weapon license shall complete the firearm safety and suicide prevention video				
15		requirements in section 62.1-04-06.				
16	SEC	TION 5. Section 62.1-04-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted				
17	as follow	/S:

20	<u>1.</u>	The bureau of criminal investigation shall coordinate with the behavioral health division				
21		of the department of human services to create a firearm safety and suicide prevention				
22		<u>video.</u>				
23	<u>2.</u>	The video must be accessible online, no longer than ten minutes in length, and include				
24		information about:				
25		a. Safe handling, storage, and use of firearms in a home;				
26		b. Individuals who are at-risk and individuals who are legally prohibited from				
27		possessing firearms; and				
28		c. Suicide prevention awareness.				
29	<u>3.</u>	Before an individual may receive or renew a concealed weapons license under section				
30		62.1-04-03, the individual shall view the firearm safety and prevention video and				
31		submit proof in the form required by the bureau of criminal investigation.
