10		question" is the side that voted "aye" on a question that passed, and "nay" on a
11		question that failed);
12		b. The member did not vote on the question; or
13		c. The member voted on the question and the ayes and nays were not recorded.
14	2.	A motion to reconsider must be decided by a majority vote of the members-elect,
15		except that a motion to reconsider adoption of an amendment must be decided by a
16		majority vote of the members present.
17	3.	In the case of a bill, resolution, or amendment to the Constitution, the motion to
18		reconsider, if made after the end of the next legislative day following the action on the
19		measure, requires a two-thirds vote of the members-elect.
20	4.	The vote by which any measure passed or failed to pass may not be reconsidered
