- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to initial teaching licenses for individuals completing alternative teacher certification
- 3 program.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-13-10. Criteria for teacher licensure.
- The board shall establish by rule the criteria for teacher licensure and the process for
 issuing teaching licenses. The criteria must include considerations of character,
 adequate educational preparation, and general fitness to teach.
 - The board may not require a teacher who graduated from an accredited teacher education program on or before September 1, 1980, to earn any college credits in native American or other multicultural courses as a condition of licensure or license renewal.
- This section does not affect the validity of teaching certificates in effect on July 31, 2001.
- This section does not affect the qualifications for career and technical education
 certificates, as otherwise established by law.
- 19 <u>5.</u> The board shall grant an initial license to an individual who:
- 20 <u>a. Possesses a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution;</u>
- 21 <u>b. Passes a criminal history record check required by section 15.1-13-14; and</u>
- 22 <u>c. Successfully completes an alternative teacher certification program operated by a</u>
 23 <u>nonprofit organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue</u>
- 24 <u>Code [26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3)], which:</u>

1			<u>(1)</u>	Operates in at least five states;
2			<u>(2)</u>	Has operated an alternative teacher certification program for at least ten

4			<u>(3)</u>	Requires applicants to pass a subject area and pedagogy examination,
5				known as the professional teaching knowledge examination, to receive
6				certification.
7	<u>6.</u>	An individual who obtains an initial license under subsection 5 is authorized to teach		
8		the subject and educational levels for which the individual has succe		
9		the program described under subsection 5.		
10	<u>7.</u>	Upon completing two years of teaching under an initial license issued under		
11		subsection 5, the licensee is eligible to apply for a five-year renewal license if the		
12		individual:

15		<u>b.</u>	Meet	ts the requirements of section 15.1-13-35 within two years of initial licensure;
