## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1013**

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the commissioner of 2 university and school lands; to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 1 of section-3 21-10-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the investments of the state investment 4 board; to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 15-01-02 of the North Dakota Century 5 Code, relating to the investments of the board of university and school lands; to create and 6 enact a new section to chapter 15-02 of the North Dakota Century Code; relating to investment 7 reports: to repeal section 57-51-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the energy 8 impact fund; to provide for transfers; to provide for distributions from permanent funds; to 9 provide an exemption; to provide a report; and to provide an effective date; and to provide a 10 contingent effective date.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from the state lands maintenance fund and the oil and gas impact grant fund in the state treasury to the commissioner of university and school lands for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commissioner of university and school lands, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, as follows:

The commissioner of university and school lands shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

**SECTION 3. DISTRIBUTIONS TO STATE INSTITUTIONS.** Pursuant to article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, the board of university and school lands shall distribute during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, the following amounts, from the permanent funds managed for the benefit of the following entities:

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SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE—CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 6 and 7 of this Act become effective on July 1, 2021, or earlier if the commissioner of board and university and school lands notifies the legislative council that the board of university and school lands approved, by a majority vote, transferring the board of university and school lands' investments to the state investment board. Section 87 of this Act becomes effective on June 30, 2021.
